A&T Breakdown: A&T secured one of its biggest wins in recent memory on Saturday with a come-from-behind 45-38 win over Campbell. It was the Aggies biggest come-from-behind win in the Sam Washington era and the biggest homecoming rally in school history. The Aggies came from 18 down at halftime to win the ballgame and remain undefeated in the Big South Conference.

Coach Washington (Miss. Valley State '82): The 2022 season marks his fourth season on the sideline and his fifth overall at A&T after the Aggies canceled the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He won MEAC coach of the year in 2018 and has two conference championships and two black college football national titles to his credit. He had the best first-two-year start (19 wins) of any head coach in A&T history.

Norfolk Breakdown: The Spartans have struggled this season. They are coming off two straight blowout losses to Delaware State and Howard entering this week's ballgame. The Bison outscored Norfolk 35-14 in the second half Saturday to secure a 49-21 win in Norfolk, Va. The Spartans only compiled 229 yards of offense but did get 114 yards rushing and a touchdown on seven carries from Jordin Lennon.

Odums (NCCU '97): Odums returns to Aggeland after spending three seasons at A&T as an assistant coach. For the final two years, he was A&T's defensive coordinator. Odums came to Norfolk after experiencing many successes over his nine seasons as the head coach at Southern University. He went 63-32 there, winning the SWAC in 2013. He also won four SWAC West Division titles.

A FAMILIAR FOE, COACH RETURN TO TRUIST

► The college football fraternity is small, so it is not unusual to see numerous connections among the coaching ranks. The HBCU football fraternity is even smaller. Therefore, when two HBCUs who used to occupy the same space in the CIAA and the MEAC get together, there will be some familiarity.

► On Saturday, A&T will renew its rivalry with the Norfolk State Spartans. It is a matchup that spans 60 years and 44 games played.

► The two head coaches, A&T's Sam Washington and Norfolk's Dawson Odums, have a rich history together, with Washington recruiting Odums to North Carolina Central in 1994. Washington served as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at NCCU, while Odums was a star defensive lineman at the university.

► Odums has some history with A&T in his own right. He served as an assistant coach at A&T from 2008-10. Over his final two years at A&T, he was the defensive coordinator. Odums coached 16 games at what is now known as Truist Stadium. Washington succeeded him as the Aggies defensive coordinator in 2011.

► Odums will have a challenging task in his return to East Greensboro. The Aggies have won five straight after an 0-3 start and find themselves in the thick of the NCAA Division I-FCS playoff hunt entering the 10th week of the season.

► A&T is tied atop the Big South standings at 3-0 with the Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs. The Bulldogs have the week off before playing Campbell in a Big South matchup, while the Aggies take a break from conference play this week.

► The Aggies last trip to the NCAA playoffs came in 2016 when they lost to the Richmond Spiders of the CAA, 39-10 at Richmond.

► If the Aggies win on Saturday, it will guarantee their ninth winning season in 10 years. It will also mark only the third time in program history that the Aggies have started 0-3 but finished with a winning record. The Aggies finished 7-4 in 1977 after an 0-3 start and 6-5 in 1985 after losing the first three games.

A&T BY THE NUMBERS

3— It is the number of MEAC opponents the Aggies have on the schedule. That's half the league. The Aggies lost to N.C. Central on Sept. 3, 28-13. A&T then defeated S.C. State on Sept. 24, 41-27. They face Norfolk State on Nov. 5. A&T spent 50 years in the MEAC before transitioning to the Big South.

3 — It is the number of names the Aggies home stadium has had since 2019. The Aggies home facility was called Aggie Stadium for 38 years starting in 1981. The name was changed to BB&T Stadium before the 2019 season and later changed to Truist Stadium.

4 — It is the number of first-time opponents the Aggies have on the schedule this season. A&T lost to North Dakota State before defeating Bryant (Oct. 1), Edward Waters (Oct. 15) and Campbell (Oct. 29).

4 — It is the number of quarterbacks the Aggies played against S.C. State on Sept. 24 in Zachary Yeager, Eli Brickhandler, Jalen Fowler and Alston Hooker.

7 — It is the school record for consecutive 100-yard rushing games now held by Bhayshul Tuten who had his sixth consecutive 100-yard rushing game last week at Robert Morris. He broke Tarik Cohen's 2015 record of five.

7 — It is the number of times the Aggies ranked in the top-10 in total defense nationally in the previous nine seasons. They were top-10 in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2017, 2018 and 2019. They are ranked 12th nationally this season.

8 — It is the number of Power Five transfers on the Aggies rosters this season, including Karon Prunty, Elijah Bowick, Mychale Salahuddin, DJ Crossen, Mario Love Jr., Tairiq Stewart, Ger-Cari Caldwell and Robert Porcher IV.

11 — It is the number of 1,000-yard single-season rushers the A&T has had since the 2007 season.

11 — The Aggies have 11 players on their current roster who have undergraduate degrees. Quarterback Jalen Fowler has had his degree for two years, while still playing for the Aggies.

22 — It is the number of times in the past 10 seasons the Aggies have prevented an opponent from scoring a touchdown. The Aggies have shutout opponents 11 times in 11 years.

48 — It is the number of pass attempts Zachary Yeager had against NCCU on Sept. 3. He was two shy of breaking the program's single-game record of 49 held by Maseo Bolin since the 1994 season.

58 —A&T has played 124 games with Washington being involved with the defense. A&T has held 58 opponents under 80 yards rushing in the past 11 seasons.

72 — It is the number of times since Sam Washington came to A&T in 2011 that A&T has held a team under 100 yards rushing.

COVERING NORTH CAROLINA A&T FOOTBALL

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: A&T will hold its weekly football press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at noon. Those press conferences will take place in the student center on campus, mostly in Deese Ballroom. The Sept. 5 and Nov. 7 press conferences will take place in Moore Gymnasium. Head coach Sam Washington will go first followed by players. All press conferences are streamed live on Facebook.

PRACTICES: Practices are open to the media if they are given prior approval by associate athletics director for communications Brian Holloway. Video is permitted during certain moments and use of footage from practice must be limited to drills and plays after the ball has been snapped. No formations are to be shot by videographers or photographers.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to ncataggies.com, go to the left side of the website. Pulldown the menu option, scroll down to inside athletics and then scroll down to Football & Basketball Credential Requests and click the link. Fill out the form to request. Credential requests must be made as early as possible. Credentials are limited to media who are there in a working capacity. Media credentials are allotted based on websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network. They are also allotted to daily newspapers, network affiliate television stations, magazines and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located at DeHuguley Parking Lot on North Benbow Road. Please arrive to the game in a timely because parking in the lot is limited. The best way to reach the lot is to make a right or left from Market Street because there will be roads closed off on gameday. Parking passes may not be picked up at will call and must be requested during the credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will leave DeHuguley Parking Lot and walk down Sullivan Street to enter through the front of the stadium. The media will call table will be located in the General Classroom Building across from the DeHuguley Parking Lot at the end of North Benbow.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received at media will call or the skybox at the stadium. Gameday flip cards will be available at media will call, the multipurpose room inside the Bryan Fitness & Wellness Center or the skybox. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Usage of footage from practices is limited. Press conferences, practice footage and other content will be available to the media upon request or the athletics department social sites (Facebook, Twitter, YouTube).

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO SHOW: The A&T Football coach's show gives fans the opportunity to hear Coach Washington take questions from host Donal Ware concerning A&T Football. The talk show will air live on Facebook every Monday at 12:30 p.m., and on Thursdays on WSJS 96.3 FM and 1400AM.

WASHINGTON MONUMENTS

FIRST TWO SEASONS

No N.C. A&T coach in school history has had a better first two seasons than Sam Washington. In his first two seasons on the sidelines, Washington has won 19 games with two MEAC titles, two Celebration Bowl wins and two HBCU national titles. He has more wins over his first two seasons than any other Aggies coach in school history. Hornsby Howell won 14 games in his first two seasons and Rod Broadway won 12 games in his first two.

THERE ARE ONLY THREE

Sam Washington is only one of three active coaches with multiple HBCU national titles. Washington has led the Aggies to back-to-back HBCU titles in 2018 and 2019. Two other active coaches with multiple HBCU titles are S.C. State's Buddy Pough (3) and Connell Maynor (3). Maynor is a N.C. A&T graduate who won two HBCU titles at Winston-Salem State and one at Alabama A&M.

10-WIN SEASONS

Sam Washington won 10 games in his first season on his way to winning MEAC coach of the year honors in 2018. Washington is only one of two coaches in A&T history with 10 wins in his first season on the job. George Small won 10 games his rookie season in 2003. In both cases, each man won the MEAC title and led their respective teams to postseason appearances. Small's team lost in the first round of playoffs, and Washington led the Aggies to a Celebration Bowl victory.

PRESEASON UPDATES

The respect for the North Carolina A&T football program still exists. The Aggies headed into the 2022 season as the Big South Conference favorites. In a preseason poll of Big South head coaches, the Aggies received six first-place votes and 60 points total to earn preseason favorite recognition. The Big South announced the poll at the annual Big South Football Media Day presented by BuyB1.com. Coming into a season as the preseason favorite is nothing new for A&T. They have been preseason favorites for six of the last eight seasons. The Aggies were the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) preseason favorite in 2015 and 2016 and 2018-2020. Thus far the Aggies have lived up to expectations. The Aggies are off to a 3-0 start in the conference and sit in a tie for first place with Gardner-Webb.

BIG SOUTH PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE AGGIES

The Big South preseason team featured six Aggies. Linebacker Jacob Roberts, defensive end Jermaine McDaniel, defensive back Karon Prunty, left tackle Ricky Lee III, wide receiver Jamison Warren and placekicker Andrew Brown made the team. Running back Bhayshul Tuten and tight end Nicholas Dobson received honorable mention accolades.

THE DEFENSE

Roberts has emerged as one of the best defensive players in the conference. He is a two-time all-conference performer, earning second-team accolades in the MEAC in 2019 before earning second-team recognition in the Big South in 2021. Roberts has 43 tackles, including 21 solos and two for loss. He also has three passes defended, three QB hurries, one fumble recovery, two blocked kicks and a Pick-6. He ranks 15th in the conference in tackles per game (5.38). McDaniel is back from injury and had a terrific game against Edward Waters with six tackles, including four solos and four for loss. He also had four sacks and forced a fumble. McDaniel already leads the Aggies in tackles for loss (8 1/2) and sacks (5). In his first season with A&T, Prunty had a two-interception game in a win over Bryant. He is tied for the league-lead in picks with those two takeaways.

THE OFFENSE

On the offensive side, the Aggies are starting to come alive with one of the best rushing attacks in the nation. Lee and Warren are playing a big part in that. Lee started all 11 games last season and played the second-most snaps on the team among offensive linemen with 648, posting an 80 grade during the season with 475 positive plays and 16 domination blocks. Lee has started all eight games this season with the Aggies having the best rushing offense in the Big South. Warren had an outstanding freshman season. He has followed that with 18 receptions for 154 yards and a touchdown. Brown earned Big South special teams player of the week three times in 2021. He has connected on 13 of 16 field goals and 26 of 28 extra points. He leads conference in scoring, and ranks 14th in field goal percentage (.800). Meanwhile, Tuten is having a great follow-up season after a terrific freshman year. He leads the conference in rushing with 1,032 yards and eight touchdowns. He is averaging 129.0 yards per game and has gone over 100 yards rushing in his last seven games. Dobson has caught seven passes for 68 yards and a touchdown.

ROOTING TUTEN

Bhayshul had quite a day and will be rewarded handsomely for it. Tuten was named FedEx STATS Perform national offensive player of the week, Big South Conference offensive player of the week and Boxtorow national player of the week. Tuten rushed for a homecoming-record 256 yards and two touchdowns on 30 carries. It marked his seventh straight 100-yard rushing game this season as he continues to extend his school record. If he rushes for 100-plus yards in each of the Aggies remaining three games, he will break Tarik Cohen's single-season record for 100-yard games, which stands at nine (2015). Tuten becomes the 10th different player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Tarik Cohen, Maurice Hicks, Jah-Maine Martin, James White, Marquell Cartwright, Mike Ferguson, Mike Mayhew, Milton Shaw and Maurice Smith. Tuten has 1,032 yards on the season. That is currently the 14th-best rushing season in school history. A&T has at least three games remaining on its schedule in 2022. Tuten's 256 yards on the ground marked the 13th time an A&T back has gone over 200 yards in a game. It is tied for the sixth-best single-game rushing performance in school history, tying Cohen's 256 on Oct. 6, 2016, against Norfolk State. It was the same night Cohen broke the MEAC's all-time rushing record. Tuten's 30 attempts are tied for the ninth-most in a single game by an Aggie as he joined George Ragsdale (11/1/75) and Mike Mayhew (11/17/12). Tuten now leads the Big South in all-purpose yards per game (155.62), rush yards per carry (6.88), rushing yards (1,032), rushing yards per game (129.0) and total touchdowns (10).

CLOSING OUT LAST WEEK

The Aggies staged their largest come-from-behind win in school history on Saturday, coming from 18 points down at halftime to beat Campbell 45-38. A&T has now won 10 out of their last 11 homecoming games and improved to 24-17 in homecoming games played at Truist Stadium. The Aggies moved to .500 in homecoming games overall at 46-46-4. The Aggies won for the fifth time in 18 games during the Sam Washington era when trailing at halftime. In addition, they won for just the third time in 15 games when trailing after three quarters. Fowler's 77-yard touchdown throw to Zach Leslie was the longest of his career, topping his 74-yarders at Furman and Hampton last season. Speaking of Leslie, the graduate caught four passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns. It marked the fifth time he has had a two-touchdown reception game in his career. Leslie had 118 yards receiving last week at Robert Morris, which marks the second time in his career he has had back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. He had three straight 100-yard receiving games during the 2019 season. Leslie had 1,866 career receiving yards, leaving him 134 yards shy of becoming only the fourth receiver in school history to record 2,000 or more receiving yards in a career. The Aggies converted their first two-point conversation of the season when Fowler connected with Leslie in the fourth quarter. Linebacker Joseph Stuckey's streak of 28 straight starts ended on Saturday against Campbell.

SCOUTING NORFOLK STATE

Norfolk State comes into the game with two straight blowout losses at the hands of MEAC opponents. The Spartans have had trouble slowing down their opponents on offense this season. They have the worst defense in the MEAC, surrendering 436.9 yards per game, and they also have the worst offense in the league, compiling 285.9 yards per game. However, in their one win this season, the Spartans did post 384 yards of offense in the 24-21 win. Quarterback Otto Kuhns threw for 288 yards and an interception on 25-for-34 passing in the game. Kuhns has completed 55.2 percent of his passes this season while throwing for 983 yards, four touchdowns and five interceptions. He averages 163.8 passing yards per game. Jordin Lennon leads the Spartans in rushing. He is coming off a 114-yard rushing performance in the Spartans loss to Howard. He averages 4.6 yards per carry and has scored three touchdowns. J.J. Davis and Kevon King also contribute in the backfield. The Spartans bring in the MEAC's leading tackler in Tyler Long. Long has 75 tackles, including three for loss and three sacks. He also has an interception on the season. Unfortunately for the Spartans, they surrender 227.4 yards on the ground per game. They will have to face an Aggies team that ran for 333 yards last week.

JERMAINE MCDANIEL IS BACK

Jermaine McDaniel has been heavily affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and injuries. He missed seven games last year with a combination of COVID-19 and injuries. He missed the first four games this season with a shoulder and leg injury. But when he is on the field, he significantly impacts the Aggies. In only three games played this season, he already has 11 tackles, including eight solo tackles and 7 ½ tackles for loss. He also has five sacks, one pass breakup and one sack. He already leads the team in tackles for loss and sacks. McDaniel is an Appalachian State transfer who played his first season in AggieLand in 2019. In 18 games played for the Aggies, McDaniel has made 64 tackles, including 45 solo tackles and 28 tackles for loss. He also has 16 ½ sacks, four pass breakups and has forced a fumble.

ZACH IS ALSO BACK!

McDaniel is not the only Aggie veteran making a comeback. Graduate wide receiver Zach Leslie missed five games last season with an Achilles injury sustained in the preseason. He has also missed three games this season with a leg injury before returning to action on Oct. 22 at Robert Morris. Leslie caught two first-half touchdown passes. It marked the fourth time he had two TD receptions in a game in his career. He also had two touchdown receptions at East Carolina (9/2/18) versus Florida A&M (10/13/18) and at Norfolk State (10/5/19). Leslie caught seven passes for 118 yards to mark his seventh career 100-yard receiving game. Leslie has 1,866 career receiving yards to rank sixth all-time in program history. His 124 receptions are sixth all-time.

A&T'S HOMECOMING HISTORY

The Aggies welcomed home their alumni on Oct. 29 in front of its usual sellout crowd. The Aggies are looking forward to playing the school's 97th homecoming and the 41st at Truist Stadium. The following are some A&T homecoming facts.

- ▶ The Aggies are 45-47-4 at their annual homecoming. The Aggies are 23-17 in homecoming games played at Truist Stadium.
- ▶ A&T's most frequent opponent on homecoming is Morgan State. The Aggies have played Morgan State 25 times during homecoming, with the most recent game coming in 2010 when the Bears beat the Aggies 27-14. The Aggies are 9-14-2 against the Bears at homecoming.
- ▶ The most points the Aggies have ever scored during homecoming is 73 points against Bethune-Cookman on Nov. 2, 1996. It was also the Aggies most lopsided win and the best-attended game (29,786).
- ▶ The most points against the Aggies at homecoming came on Oct. 30, 1976, when Morgan State scored 45 points against the Aggies. The most lopsided loss also came against Morgan State. The Aggies lost to Morgan State 41-3 on Oct. 11, 2008.

THE A&T FOOTBALL GRADUATES

North Carolina A&T has 11 players on their current roster who have already obtained their undergraduate degrees. Quarterback Jalen Fowler and wide receiver Zach Leslie will enter their second season on the Aggies roster with his undergraduate. Fowler is working toward his master's degree in graphic communications. Leslie is an undecided graduate student. The players who graduated in the fall of 2021 include defensive ends Devin Harrell (sports science and fitness management), Robert Porcher IV (liberal studies), and Jermaine McDaniel (agricultural and environmental systems) and center Dacquari Wilson (sports science and fitness management). The spring 2022 graduates include nose guard Karfa Kaba (liberal studies), wide receiver Jordan McDaniel (sports science and fitness management), cornerback Amir McNeill (liberal studies), defensive tackle Shomari Wallace (liberal studies) and offensive lineman Tim Williams (applied engineering technology).

ON THE MOVE AGAIN

North Carolina A&T's athletics department is once again confronting a conference change in the crazy world of college athletics. A&T will have 15 of its 17 varsity sports playing in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) starting in 2022-23. The only two sports not transferring to the CAA are bowling and football. Bowling will remain in the MEAC because the CAA does not sponsor the sport. Football remains in the Big South Conference for a different reason. The CAA certainly does have football. It is perhaps the best FCS football conference in America. But if the Aggies had departed the Big South this season, it would have potentially left the conference with five teams. It threatened their automatic qualifier status after schools such as Hampton, Monmouth, Kennesaw State and North Alabama departed the league during the offseason. Monmouth and Hampton joined the CAA. In August, Big South school Campbell announced it will become a CAA school starting in 2023-24. Next season, the Aggies will join the CAA, which has 14 other teams.

FOWLER EMERGES FROM TALENTED QB ROOM

The Aggies came into the season with an interesting quarterback battle between four players. Jalen Fowler came into the season as the incumbent starter. Fowler started nine games in 2021, throwing for 1,774 yards, 10 touchdowns and eight interceptions while completing 55.7 percent of his passes. Fowler did not play in the first game against N.C. Central, and did not make the start against North Dakota State. Instead, redshirt freshman Zachary Yeager started both games. Fowler did rotate in against the Bison, and played most of the snaps after Yeager left the game in the first quarter with a shoulder injury. A Fowler fumble did lead to a Bison touchdown. He bounced back to make his start of the season at Duke on Sept. 17. He completed 8 of 14 passes for 89 yards. Aggie fans were also introduced to freshman quarterback Eli Brickhandler, who threw his first career touchdown pass during the game. Brickhandler's performance put the QB position up in the air with three different men having a chance to start during the Aggies home opener against S.C. State on Sept. 24. Yeager made the start. Still, amazingly, the Aggies played four quarterbacks in the game, including redshirt freshman Alston Hooker. Yeager left the game early with a concussion, and Brickhandler left the game with a knee injury. Fowler completed 8 of 14 passes for 121 yards and two touchdowns. Fowler has gone on to start the Aggies last four games, throwing for a combined 883 yards, nine touchdowns and two interceptions on 62-for-94 (.660) passing.

THE FAMILY THAT QUARTERBACKS TOGETHER STAYS TOGETHER

Alan Hooker broke 18 program passing records as North Carolina A&T's starting quarterback in the mid-80s as he led the Aggies to their first outright MEAC title in 1986. So it appears he has passed on the passing gene. Hooker has two sons who both currently play college football. His son Hendon Hooker served as Virginia Tech's starting quarterback for two years before transferring to the University of Tennessee. Hendon entered this season as a second-year starter at Tennessee. After Hendon upset Alabama 52-49, he is a Heisman Trophy candidate. He has the potential to play on the next level. Meanwhile, Alan's younger son, Alston, is a redshirt freshman QB at his father's alma mater, A&T. A&T football even brought Alan's No. 11 jersey out of honorarium so that Alston could wear it. Head coach Sam Washington said Alston's decision-making is impressive, and he has a good enough arm to win games on the FCS level. He also called him very intelligent with a lot of football knowledge, which probably comes from heredity. Alston has played in four games this season and has thrown for 28 yards.

THE AGGIES DEFENSE IS BACK ON TRACK

The Aggies had the 39th-best defense in the nation last season. That is fine for most programs but not for one used to finishing in the top-10 nationally. The Aggies even failed to lead their conference in rushing defense, which has not happened since 2014. The three highest totals the Aggies surrendered to a Division I-FCS opponent last season were the 34 points to North Alabama, the 35 they surrendered to Monmouth and the 35 Gardner-Webb scored in the season finale for a total of 104 points. When you compare that to the 190 points that gave up all season in 2019 and the measly 149 opponents scored against them in 2018, it is easy to see why a defensive coach like Washington can't wait to correct what happened last season. But in 2022, the Aggies stingy defense emerged again. The only Division I-FCS opponent to reach 300 yards of offense against the Aggies this season was S.C. State, who had exactly 300 yards on Sept. 24. The Aggies have the top-ranked defense in the Big South, and they are ranked 12th nationally. A&T also has the best rush defense and second-best pass defense in the Big South. They rank 10th nationally in run defense.

Sam Washington became the 19th head football coach in North Carolina A&T State history on January 9, 2018.

In 2021, Washington entered North Carolina A&T football into a new chapter in its history when the Aggies played their first season in the Big South Conference after the program spent 50 years in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC).

Washington led A&T football through a tremendous trial as a worldwide pandemic led to the cancellation of the Aggies 2020 season. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, Washington led A&T to the program's 11th overall MEAC championship. In his second season, Washington also won his second black college football national title with a 64-44 win over Alcorn State in the annual Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, Ga.

Washington accumulated more wins in his first two seasons (19) than any other head coach in A&T history. In addition, Washington has already had 11 first-team all-conference selections from 10 different players in four seasons. In 2018, Darry Johnson, Jr. earned MEAC defensive player of the year before being drafted by the Buffalo Bills in the seventh round.

The Aggies have also had two players earn MEAC offensive lineman of the year under Washington, and running back Jah-Maine Martin earned multiple All-American honors in 2019.

In his first season as the Aggies head coach, Washington led A&T to the MEAC championship. Also, in his first season, Washington led the Aggies to their second straight Celebration Bowl victory and the third in four years. The Aggies were also named black college football national champions, finishing 10-2.

For his efforts, Washington became the second A&T rookie coach to capture MEAC coach of the year as he tied the school record for wins by a first-year coach.

Before being promoted to head coach, Washington served as the Aggies defensive coordinator and secondary coach for seven years under legendary head coach Rod Broadway. In 2015, Broadway promoted Washington to associate head coach. He established himself as one of the best defensive minds in Division I-FCS.

As the Aggies defensive coordinator, the Aggies have finished out of the top-20 in total defense only once nationally. In two of those seasons, they were second nationally in total defense. In addition, the run defense has finished outside the top-10 nationally only once, including leading the nation in run defense in 2013.

In three of Washington's seven seasons as the Aggies D-coordinator, the Aggies finished among the top-10 teams in the nation in passing defense efficiency, including No. 1 in 2012.

The Aggies have been the MEAC's No. 1 total defense and scoring defense five times in the past nine seasons played. In addition, they have had the No. 1 total defense in the conference from 2016-19. A&T has also had the No. 1 rush defense in the conference seven times in nine years.

In his role as the secondary coach, seven different cornerbacks earned All-MEAC success in D'Vonte Graham, Justin Ferrell, Tony McRae,

Donald Mattocks, Marquis Boyan, Timadre Abram and Frank "Mac" McCain III, with only Boyan not earning first-team honors. Graham, McRae, Mattocks and McCain have all earned All-American honors from various organizations. In addition, three of Washington's corners – McRae, McCain and Ayodeji Olatoye – spent multiple seasons on NFL rosters.

Olatoye made the Dallas Cowboys 53-man roster in 2015 and played in the Super Bowl in 2017. McRae has had stints with the Raiders, Bengals, Ravens, Bills and Lions. McCain became an undrafted free agent for the Denver Broncos before signing with the Philadelphia Eagles.

Before arriving at A&T, Washington spent four seasons as Grambling's defensive backs coach under Broadway. Washington played a significant role in the Tigers' dominating defense in 2007. Nationally, the Tigers ranked 12th in total defense. Grambling led the nation in turnover margin the following season and was third in scoring defense. Defensive back

Desmond Lenard was ninth in the country in interceptions per game. Three other defensive backs ranked among the Top-50 in interceptions per game that season.

Before Washington came to Grambling, he spent five years at his alma mater Mississippi Valley State. Washington served as an assistant head coach, defensive coordinator, and in his traditional role as defensive backs coach. In his first season at MVSU, he transformed the Delta Devils defense from one of the worst defenses in the SWAC into the league's No. 2 ranked defense.

Before returning to MVSU, Washington spent one season (2001) as A&T's special teams coordinator under head coach Bill Hayes. Under Washington, the Aggies had one of the best special teams seasons in school history. The Aggies led the nation in punt return yardage per game, with punt returner Curtis Deloatch breaking the NCAA's single-season record for punt return touchdowns. Punter Yonnick Matthews was second in the MEAC in punting.

Washington also spent eight seasons at N.C. Central as the school's assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. Led by All-American Buddy Crutchfield, Adrian Jones and Trei Oliver in 1996, Washington put together one of the best Division II defensive backfields. In addition, the Eagles went 8-3 with the best pass defense in the CIAA. In 1992, he began work at Johnson C. Smith. He was named the assistant head coach. His other duties included being the defensive and special teams coordinator, the defensive backs coach and the head track and field coach.

Washington's coaching profession also includes a stint with Bethune-Cookman (1987-92), where he helped the Wildcats take a share of the 1988 MEAC championship. In 1998, he secured an internship with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers under legendary head coach Tony Dungy.

Washington spent four seasons in the NFL with stops in Pittsburgh and Cincinnati. As a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Washington intercepted at least one pass in five consecutive games during the 1984 season. Before making it to the NFL, Washington played cornerback for Mississippi Valley State, where he battled daily in practice with a wide receiver named Jerry Rice.

Washington earned a B.S. degree in physical education from MVSU in 1982. He was inducted into the MVSU Hall of Fame in 2006. He and his wife Donna have one son, Jarvis.
