The winner will win the Big South title and advance to the Division I-FCS playoffs to play on November 26. Coach Washington (Miss. Valley State '82): The 2022 season marks his fourth season on the sideline and his fifth overall at A&T after the Aggies canceled the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He won MEAC coach of the year in 2018 and has two conference championships and two black college football national titles to his credit. He had the best firsttwo-year start (19 wins) of any head coach in A&T history.

- The Aggies path to the NCAA Division I-FCS playoffs has been made straight since Bryant defeated Campbell two weeks ago. Bryant eliminated all tiebreak- Largest A&T Win: 42, 9/2/17 er scenarios with the win, leaving the Aggies in the position of having to win on Nov. 19 at Gardner-Webb to claim their 17th conference title in program history.
- On Saturday, A&T must win its final game as a Big South Conference school to advance to its first playoff appearance in six years.
- ► The Bryant win over Campbell put Gardner-Webb in the same position as A&T. Win on Nov. 19, and they advance to their first-ever FCS playoff appearance. The last time the Runnin' Bulldogs advanced to the postseason was in 1992 as an NAIA school.
- The winner-take-all contest features the nation's sixth-best defense in A&T versus the nation's 17th-best offense. The Aggies strength is stopping the run, and the Bulldogs strength is throwing the football. The Aggies are ranked seventh nationally in rushing defense, and the Bulldogs are ranked eighth in passing offense.
- The quarterback situation will be essential. GWU QB Bailey Fisher leads the conference in completion percentage (.655) and has thrown for 2,594 yards, 17 touchdowns, and nine interceptions. The Tennessee Tech transfer has also run for eight touchdowns.
- Aggies QB Jalen Fowler's numbers are not as gaudy, but he is having a solid season. He leads the conference in passing efficiency and passing yards per completion (12.86). He has thrown for 1,543 yards, 14 touchdowns, and four interceptions.
- But Fowler is hobbled with a foot injury and did not start against Charleston Southern last week. He entered the game in the second quarter with the game tied at 7 and led two touchdown drives to help the Aggies win.
- ► The Aggies other options at quarterback are freshman quarterback Alston Hooker who started against CSU, and West Point transfer Roman Purcell who has not taken a snap this season.
- Zachary Yeager who started the season as A&T's QB1 is out for the season. Eli Brickhandler is questionable after being injured against S.C. State on Sept. 24.

COVERING NORTH CAROLINA A&T FOOTBALL

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: A&T will hold its weekly footbball press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at noon. Those press conferences will take place in the student center on campus, mostly in Deese Ballroom. The Sept. 5 and Nov. 7 press conferences will take place in Moore Gymnasium. Head coach Sam Washington will go first followed by players. All press conferences are streamed live on Facebook.

PRACTICES: Practices are open to the media if they are given prior approval by associate athletics director for communications Brian Holloway. Video is permitted during certain moments and use of footage from practice must be limited to drills and plays after the ball has been snapped. No formations are to be shot by videographers or photographers.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to ncataggies.com, go to the left side of the website. Pulldown the menu option, scroll down to inside athletics and then scroll down to Football & Basketball Credential Requests and click the link. Fill out the form to request. Credential requests must be made as early as possible. Credentials are limited to media who are there in a working capacity. Media credentials are allotted based on websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entiity/network. They are also alloted to daily newspapers, network affiliate television stations, magazines and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located at DeHuguley Parking Lot on North Benbow Road. Please arrive to the game in a timely because parking in the lot is limited. The best way to reach the lot is to make a right or left from Market Street because there will be roads closed off on gameday. Parking passes may not be picked up at will call and must be requested during the credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will leave DeHuguley Parking Lot and walk down Sullivan Street to enter through the front of the stadium. The media will call table will be located in the General Classroom Building across from the DeHuguley Parking Lot at the end of North Benbow.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received at media will call or the skybox at the stadium. Gameday flip cards will be available at media will call, the multipurpose room inside the Bryan Fitness & Wellness Center or the skybox. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Usage of footage from practices is limited. Press conferences, practice footage and other content will be available to the media upon request or the athletics department social sites (Facebook, Twitter, YouTube).

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO SHOW: The A&T Football coach's show gives fans the opportunity to hear Coach Washington take questions from host Donal Ware concerning A&T Football. The talk show will air live on Facebook every Monday at 12:30 p.m., and on Thursdays on WSJS 96.3 FM and 1400AM.

WASHINGTON MONUMENTS

FIRST TWO SEASONS

No N.C. A&T coach in school history has had a better first two seasons than Sam Washington. In his first two seasons on the sidelines, Washington has won 19 games with two MEAC titles, two Celebration Bowl wins and two HBCU national titles. He has more wins over his first two seasons than any other Aggies coach in school history. Hornsby Howell won 14 games in his first two seaons and Rod Broadway won 12 games in his first two.

THERE ARE ONLY THREE

Sam Washington is only one of three active coaches with multiiple HBCU national titles. Washington has led the Aggies to back-to-back HBCU titles in 2018 and 2019. Two other active coaches with multiple HBCU titles are S.C. State's Buddy Pough (3) and Connell Maynor (3). Maynor is a N.C. A&T graduate who won two HBCU titles at Winston-Salem State and one at Alabama A&M.

10-WIN SEASONS

Sam Washington won 10 games in his first season on his way to winning MEAC coach of the year honors in 2018. Washington is only one of two coaches in A&T history with 10 wins in his first season on the job. George Small won 10 games his rookie season in 2003. In both cases, each man won the MEAC title and led their respective teams to postseason apperances. Small's team lost in the first round of playoffs, and Washington led the Aggies to a Celebration Bowl victory.

PRESEASON UPDATES

The respect for the North Carolina A&T football program still exists. The Aggies headed into the 2022 season as the Big South Conference favorites. In a preseason poll of Big South head coaches, the Aggies received six first-place votes and 60 points total to earn preseason favorite recognition. The Big South announced the poll at the annual Big South Football Media Day presented by BuyB1.com. Coming into a season as the preseason favorite is nothing new for A&T. They have been preseason favorites for six of the last eight seasons. The Aggies were the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) preseason favorite in 2015 and 2016 and 2018-2020. Thus far the Aggies have lived up to expectations. The Aggies are 4-0 in the conference and will play 4-0 Gardner-Webb for the conference championship on Saturday.

BIG SOUTH PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE AGGIES

The Big South preseason team featured six Aggies. Linebacker Jacob Roberts, defensive end Jermaine McDaniel, defensive back Karon Prunty, left tackle Ricky Lee III, wide receiver Jamison Warren and placekicker Andrew Brown made the team. Running back Bhayshul Tuten and tight end Nicholas Dobson received honorable mention accolades.

POTENTIAL ALL-BIG SOUTH DEFENSIVE PLAYERS

Roberts has emerged as one of the best defensive players in the conference. He is a two-time all-conference performer, earning second-team accolades in the MEAC in 2019 before earning second-team recognition in the Big South in 2021. Roberts has 55 tackles, including 30 solos and three for loss. He also has five passes defended, four QB hurries, one fumbe recovery, two blocked kicks and two Pick-6's. He ranks eighth the conference in tackles per game (5.38). McDaniel is back from injury and had a terrific game against Edward Waters with six tackles, including four solos and four for loss. He also had four sacks and forced a fumble. McDaniel already leads the Aggies in tackles for loss (8 1/2) and sacks (5). In his first season with A&T, Prunty had a two-interception game in a win over Bryant. He is tied for the league-lead in picks with those two takeaways.

THE OFFENSE

The possibilities on the offensive are numerous. The Aggies offensive line has been tremendous, led by left tackle Ricky Lee III. The Aggies have allowed the fewest sacks in the conference, and Lee has played a key role in that. On the other exterior of the offensive line at right tackle, Tairiq Stewart has been great in run blocking as the Aggies lead the conference in rushing. Dacquari Wilson has shown versatility this season, starting at left guard and center. Bhayshul Tuten is a guaranteed all-conference performer, leading the conference in rushing and all-purpose yards. He is ninth and fifth in those two categories nationally, respectively. Tuten could also win offensive player of the year.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Andrew Brown looks to have the best shot to earn postseason honors as a special teamer. Brown is 13-for-18 in field goals, which ranks him third in FG pct. (.722). Taymon Cooke has 314 kickoff return yards and a touchdown.

ROOTIN' TUTEN

Bhayshul Tuten is having quite the season. He was named FedEx Ground STATS Perform national offensive player of the week, Big South Conference offensive player of the week, and Boxtorow national player of the week on Oct. 31 after rushing for 256 yards and two touchdowns on Oct. 29 versus Campbell. Tuten has rushed for 100 yards in nine consecutive games this season, tying the Big South record for straight 100-yard rushing games in a season. If he runs for 100-plus yards against Gardner-Webb, he will break Tarik Cohen's single-season record for 100-yard games, which he set in 2015. Tuten becomes the 10th different player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Tarik Cohen, Maurice Hicks, Jah-Maine Martin, James White, Marquell Cartwright, Mike Ferguson, Mike Mayhew, Milton Shaw, and Maurice Smith. Tuten has 1,255 yards and 12 touchdowns on the season. That is currently the eighth-best single-season rushing performance in school history. A&T has at least two games remaining on its schedule in 2022. Tuten's 256 yards on Oct. 29 marked the 13th time an A&T back has gone over 200 yards in a game. It is tied for the sixth-best single-game rushing performance in school history, tying Cohen's 256 on Oct. 6, 2016, against Norfolk State. Tuten now leads the Big South in all-purpose yards per game (155.20), rush yards per carry (6.57), rushing yards, rushing yards per game (125.5), and total touchdowns (16). Tuten ranks in the top-10 nationally in seven categories, including rushing yards (5th).

CLOSING OUT LAST WEEK

The Aggies finished the season 6-0 at home after their win over Charleston Southern on Saturday. The Aggies are 17-4 at home under head coach Sam Washington. The Aggies have finished undefeated at Truist Stadium twice under Washington. The Aggies other undefeated seasons at home occurred in 1943, 48, 50, 51, 58, 72, 80, 85, 90, 92, 96, 99, 2003, 14, 16, 17 and 19. A&T rushed for 134 yards on Saturday. A&T has rushed for at least 100 yards in every game this season except one, an 82-yard rushing performance against N.C. Central on Sept. 3. The Aggies defense held Charleston Southern to 210 yards of offense, including 48 yards rushing. The Aggies have the sixth-best defense in Division I-FCS football, the seventh-best rushing defense and the 28th-best pass defense. The Aggies have held five opponents under 100 yards rushing this season. All five of those opponents had fewer than 80 yards rushing. The Aggies got another interception on Saturday, their 14th pick of the season. The Aggies lead the Big South in interceptions and rank eighth nationally. Sophomore Karon Prunty had the Aggies only interception on Saturday, giving him four on the season. He ranks second in the Big South. Linebacker Tyquan King led the Aggies with 11 tackles on Saturday for his fifth double-figure tackle game this season, and the sixth of his career. King needs 14 tackles to reach 100 for the season. If he gets those tackles, he will become the first Aggie to reach 100 tackles since D'Vonte Grant recorded 102 tackles and Brian Houston recorded 100 tackles in 2013.

SCOUTING GARDNER-WEBB

Gardner-Webb's potent offense begins with quarterback and Tennessee Tech transfer Bailey Fisher. Fisher is coming off a massive game against Campbell last week. Fisher threw for 361 yards and three touchdowns on 30-for-38 passing in the Runnin' Bulldogs 45-38 win. He also tossed an interception in the game. He also ran the ball 14 times for 48 yards and a touchdown. Fisher ranks 18th nationally in total offense with 273.9 yards per game, and he is responsible for 25 touchdowns this season, 17 through the air and eight on the ground. In addition, Fisher has thrown for three or more touchdowns three times this season and has thrown for more than 400 yards twice. Wofford transfer T.J. Luther is Fisher's No. 1 target. Luther has 1,010 yards receiving and seven touchdowns. He leads the conference in receiving yards and ranks third nationally. He has gone over 100 yards receiving in six straight games. Narii Gaither is also a factor in the Bulldogs offense. He is second in the conference in rushing with 578 yards, and last week at Campbell, he caught seven passes for 63 yards. The Bulldogs have a big-time pass rusher in Ty French, who has nine sacks. He also has 53 tackles, including 23 unassisted and 11 1/2 for loss. William McRainey leads the team in tackles with 77, including 29 unassisted and 6 1/2 for loss.

AGGIES CELEBRATE SENIORS

The Aggies celebrated their annual Senior Day on Saturday, honoring 14 seniors. The Aggies observed tight end DeAndre Arnold-Gaskins, quarterback Jalen Fowler, defensive end Devin Harrell, defensive tackle Karfa Kaba, fullback Romello Kimbrough, left tackle Ricky Lee III, wide receiver Zach Leslie, defensive Jermaine McDaniel Jr., cornerback Amir McNeill, linebacker Julian Monell, defensive end Robert Porcher IV, linebacker Joseph Stuckey, defensive tackle Shomari Wallace and offensive lineman Dacquari Wilson.

Fowler, Leslie, Wilson, Harrell, McNeill have been with at A&T since 2017 because of the COVID-19 pandemic. That means they are after their fourth conference championship and fourth postseason appearance. There were a few seniors who also had a pretty good Senior Day last week.

Senior Day Superlatives:

- Shomari Wallace had a career day with eight tackles, including six solo and three for loss. He also had a sack.
- Devin Harrell had four tackles, one for loss and a sack.
- Jalen Fowler completed 11 of 23 passes for 158 yards and a touchdown.
- Jermaine McDaniel had two sacks and now has 20 ½ sacks in his career.
- Robert Porcher IV finished with career highs in tackles (8) and tackles for loss (3 ½). Six of his tackles were unassisted, and he added a sack.
- Stuckey finished with five tackles and 1 ½ for loss.

CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

The Aggies are going after their sixth conference title in eight seasons next week at Gardner-Webb. If the Aggies win, it will give head coach Sam Washington his third conference championship. That would tie him with Bill Hayes and his former boss Rod Broadway for the most conference championship by an A&T head coach. Haves won all three of his conference titles outright. The Aggies have been to the postseason in five of the last six seasons. If they beat Gardner-Webb on Saturday, it would mark the Aggies first playoff appearance since 2016. The Aggies other playoff appearances occurred in 1986, 92, 99, and 03. The Aggies are 1-5 in playoff games, with their only playoff win coming in 1999 when they defeated No. 1 Tennessee State 24-10 in the first round. The Aggies are also looking for their 17th conference championship in program history. A&T won five conference titles as members of the CIAA. In addition, they won 11 MEAC titles.

THE A&T FOOTBALL GRADUATES

North Carolina A&T has 11 players on their current roster who have already obtained their undergraduate degrees. Quarterback Jalen Fowler and wide receiver Zach Leslie will enter their second season on the Aggies roster with his undergraduate. Fowler is working toward his master's degree in graphic communications. Leslie is an undecided graduate student. The players who graduated in the fall of 2021 include defensive ends Devin Harrell (sports science and fitness management), Assisted Tackles: 77, Demetrius Harrison (1988) Robert Porcher IV (liberal studies), and Jermaine McDaniel (agricultural and environmental systems) and center Dacquari Wilson (sports science and fitness management). The spring 2022 graduates include nose guard Karfa Kaba (liberal studies), wide receiver Jordan McDaniel (sports science and fitness management), cornerback Amir McNeill (liberal studies), defensive tackle Shomari Wallace (liberal studies) and offensive lineman Tim Williams (applied engineering technology).

ON THE MOVE AGAIN

A&T is once again confronting a conference change in the crazy world of college athletics. A&T has 15 of its 17 varsity sports playing in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2022-23. The only two sports not transferring to the CAA are bowling and football. Bowling will remain in the MEAC because the CAA does not sponsor the sport. Football remains in the Big South Conference for a different reason. The CAA certainly does have football. It is perhaps the best FCS football conference in America. But if the Aggies had departed the Big South this season, it would have potentially left the conference with five teams. It threatened their automatic qualifier status after schools such as Hampton, Monmouth, Kennesaw State and North Alabama departed the league during the offseason. Monmouth and Hampton joined the CAA. In August, Big South school Campbell announced it will become a CAA school starting in 2023-24. Next season, the Aggies will join the CAA, which has 14 other teams.

FOWLER EMERGES FROM TALENTED QB ROOM

The Aggies came into the season with an interesting quarterback battle between four players. Jalen Fowler came into the season as the incumbent starter. Fowler started nine games in 2021, throwing for 1,774 yards, 10 touchdowns and eight interceptions while completing 55.7 percent of his passes. Fowler did not play in the first game against N.C. Central, and did not make the start against North Dakota State. Instead, redshirt freshman Zachary Yeager started both games. Fowler did rotate in against the Bison, and played most of the snaps after Yeager left the game in the first quarter with a shoulder injury. A Fowler fumble did lead to a Bison touchdown. He bounced back to make his first start of the season at Duke on Sept. 17. He completed 8 of 14 passes for 89 yards. Aggie fans were also introduced to freshman quarterback Eli Brickhandler, who threw his first career touchdown pass during the game. Brickhandler's performance put the QB position up in the air with three different men having a chance to start during the Aggies home opener against S.C. State on Sept. 24. Yeager made the start. Still, amazingly, the Aggies played four quarterbacks in the game, including redshirt freshman Alston Hooker. Yeager left the game early with a concussion, and Brickhandler left the game with a knee injury and has not played since. Fowler completed 8 of 14 passes for 121 yards and two touchdowns. Fowler started five straight games before an injury prevented him from starting on Nov. 12 against Charleston Southern. Yeager is out for the season, Brickhandler is doubtful and Hooker is experienced, so Fowler will look to lead the Aggies to the playoffs despite his injury.

THE FAMILY THAT QUARTERBACKS TOGETHER STAYS TOGETHER

Alan Hooker broke 18 program passing records as North Carolina A&T's starting quarterback in the mid-80s as he led the Aggies to their first outright MEAC title in 1986. So it appears he has passed on the passing gene. Hooker has two sons who both currently play college football. His son Hendon Hooker served as Virginia Tech's starting quarterback for two years before transferring to the University of Tennessee. Hendon entered this season as a second-year starter at Tennessee. After Hendon upset Alabama 52-49, he is a Heisman Trophy candidate. He has the potential to play on the next level. Meanwhile, Alan's younger son, Alston, is a redshirt freshman QB at his father's alma mater, A&T. A&T football even brought Alan's No. 11 jersey out of honorarium so that Alston could wear it. Head coach Sam Washington said Alston's decision-making is impressive, and he has a good enough arm to win games on the FCS level. He also called him very intelligent with a lot of football knowledge, which probably comes from heredity. Alston has played in four games this season and has thrown for 28 yards.

THE AGGIES DEFENSE IS BACK ON TRACK

The Aggies had the 39th-best defense in the nation last season. That is fine for most programs but not for one used to finishing in the top-10 nationally. The Aggies even failed to lead their conference in rushing defense, which has not happened since 2014. The three highest totals the Aggies surrendered to a Division I-FCS opponent last season were the 34 points to North Alabama, the 35 they surrendered to Monmouth, and the 35 Gardner-Webb scored in the season finale for a total of 104 points. When you compare that to the 190 points that gave up all season in 2019 and the measly 149 opponents scored against them in 2018, it is easy to see why a defensive coach like Washington wanted it corrected. Therefore, in 2022, the Aggies stingy defense reemerged. The Aggies are ranked sixth nationally in defense. The Aggies have held eight opponents to 300 yards or less of total offense. Five of A&T's opponents have been held under 100 yards. The Aggies are looking for their eighth top-10 national ranking in defense in 11 seasons.

Sam Washington became the 19th head football coach in North Carolina A&T State history on January 9, 2018.

In 2021, Washington entered North Carolina A&T football into a new chapter in its history when the Aggies played their first season in the Big South Conference after the program spent 50 years in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC).

Washington led A&T football through a tremendous trial as a worldwide pandemic led to the cancelation of the Aggies 2020 season. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, Washington led A&T to the program's 11th overall MEAC championship. In his second season, Washington also won his second black college football national title with a 64-44 win over Alcorn State in the annual Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, Ga.

Washington accumulated more wins in his first two seasons (19) than any other head coach in A&T history. In addition, Washington has already had 11 first-team all-conference selections from 10 different players in four seasons. In 2018, Darry Johnson, Jr. earned MEAC defensive player of the year before being drafted by the Buffalo Bills in the seventh round.

The Aggies have also had two players earn MEAC offensive lineman of the year under Washington, and running back Jah-Maine Martin earned multiple All-American honors in 2019.

In his first season as the Aggies head coach, Washington led A&T to the MEAC championship. Also, in his first season, Washington led the Aggies to their second straight Celebration Bowl victory and the third in four years. The Aggies were also named black college football national champions, finishing 10-2.

For his efforts, Washington became the second A&T rookie coach to capture MEAC coach of the year as he tied the school record for wins by a first-year coach.

Before being promoted to head coach, Washington served as the Aggies defensive coordinator and secondary coach for seven years under legendary head coach Rod Broadway. In 2015, Broadway promoted Washington to associate head coach. He established himself as one of the best defensive minds in Division I-FCS.

As the Aggies defensive coordinator, the Aggies have finished out of the top-20 in total defense only once nationally. In two of those seasons, they were second nationally in total defense. In addition, the run defense has finished outside the top-10 nationally only once, including leading the nation in run defense in 2013.

In three of Washington's seven seasons as the Aggies D-coordinator, the Aggies finished among the top-10 teams in the nation in passing defense efficiency, including No. 1 in 2012.

The Aggies have been the MEAC's No. 1 total defense and scoring defense five times in the past nine seasons played. In addition, they have had the No. 1 total defense in the conference from 2016-19. A&T has also had the No. 1 rush defense in the conference seven times in nine years.

In his role as the secondary coach, seven different cornerbacks earned All-MEAC success in D'Vonte Graham, Justin Ferrell, Tony McRae,

Donald Mattocks, Marquis Boyan, Timadre Abram and Frank "Mac" McCain III, with only Boyan not earning first-team honors. Graham, McRae, Mattocks and McCain have all earned All-American honors from various organizations. In addition, three of Washington's corners – McRae, McCain and Ayodeji Olatoye – spent multiple seasons on NFL rosters.

Olatoye made the Dallas Cowboys 53-man roster in 2015 and played in the Super Bowl in 2017. McRae has had stints with the Raiders, Bengals, Ravens, Bills and Lions. McCain became an undrafted free agent for the Denver Broncos before signing with the Philadelphia Eagles.

Before arriving at A&T, Washington spent four seasons as Grambling's defensive backs coach under Broadway. Washington played a significant role in the Tigers' dominating defense in 2007. Nationally, the Tigers ranked 12th in total defense. Grambling led the nation in turnover margin the following season and was third in scoring defense. Defensive back

Desmond Lenard was ninth in the country in interceptions per game. Three other defensive backs ranked among the Top-50 in interceptions per game that season.

Before Washington came to Grambling, he spent five years at his alma mater Mississippi Valley State. Washington served as an assistant head coach, defensive coordinator, and in his traditional role as defensive backs coach. In his first season at MVSU, he transformed the Delta Devils defense from one of the worst defenses in the SWAC into the league's No. 2 ranked defense.

Before returning to MVSU, Washington spent one season (2001) as A&T's special teams coordinator under head coach Bill Hayes. Under Washington, the Aggies had one of the best special teams seasons in school history. The Aggies led the nation in punt return yardage per game, with punt returner Curtis Deloatch breaking the NCAA's single-season record for punt return touchdowns. Punter Yonnick Matthews was second in the MEAC in punting.

Washington also spent eight seasons at N.C. Central as the school's assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. Led by All-American Buddy Crutchfield, Adrian Jones and Trei Oliver in 1996, Washington put together one of the best Division II defensive backfields. In addition, the Eagles went 8-3 with the best pass defense in the CIAA. In 1992, he began work at Johnson C. Smith. He was named the assistant head coach. His other duties included being the defensive and special teams coordinator, the defensive backs coach and the head track and field coach.

Washington's coaching profession also includes a stint with Bethune-Cookman (1987-92), where he helped the Wildcats take a share of the 1988 MEAC championship. In 1998, he secured an internship with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers under legendary head coach Tony Dungy.

Washington spent four seasons in the NFL with stops in Pittsburgh and Cincinnati. As a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Washington intercepted at least one pass in five consecutive games during the 1984 season. Before making it to the NFL, Washington played cornerback for Mississippi Valley State, where he battled daily in practice with a wide receiver named Jerry Rice.

Washington earned a B.S. degree in physical education from MVSU in 1982. He was inducted into the MVSU Hall of Fame in 2006. He and his wife Donna have one son, Jarvis.
