## BIG SOUTH UNBEATENS MATCH UP

Campbell looks to stay atop the Big South standings, traveling to North Carolina A&T on Saturday, October 29. Kickoff is set for 1:00 p.m. at Truist Stadium in Greensboro, N.C.

## QUICK HITS

- Campbell is 0-3 on the road this season, with its losses coming against two ranked FCS opponents (No. 20/22 William & Mary, No. 9/6 Jackson State) and an FBS foe (East Carolina).
- The Camels look to start Big South play 3-0 for the second time in three seasons (started 3-0 in 2019, did not play a conference schedule in 2020).
- With his next sack, Brevin Allen will take over as Campbell's all-time sacks leader (20.5, Ugonna Awuruonye, 2013-15). The redshirt senior became CU's all-time tackles for loss leader in the Robert Morris win, passing Jack Ryan (36.5, 2015-18), and now holding 38 career TFLs.
- At Jackson State, Campbell registered multiple takeaways for the fourth straight game, notching an interception and a fumble recovery. CU owns nine takeaways over its last four games, plus 13 total on the season (seven games). The Camels own at least one takeaway in six of seven games.
- Campbell held Jackson State to just 2-of-14 on third down conversions. Over its last two games, the CU defense has limited opponents to 2-of-27 on third downs, also limiting Robert Morris to 0-of-13.
- Campbell is now 4-0 at home this season, outscoring opponents a combined 152-66.
- CU has led in 15 of its 16 quarters at home.
- The Camels are 2-0 to start Big South play for the third consecutive season (2019, 2021).
- CU ran a school record offensive 94 plays in the win over RMU.
- Limiting RMU to just 188 total yards, a season low for the Camel defense, Campbell allowed just eight rushing yards, tied for the second-lowest ground total allowed in its Division I era.
- CU wraps a three game road stretch at Bryant next week.

**LAST TIME OUT**

Sy'veon Wilkerson ran for 116 yards and a touchdown to help top-10 ranked Jackson State hold off visiting Campbell 22-14 at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. JSU, ranked as high as No. 6 in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll and No. 9 in the Stats Perform Poll, remained undefeated at 7-0, snapping a three-game winning streak for the Camels.

Wilkerson rushed 24 times to break the century mark for the Tigers, while J.D. Martin added 56 yards on the ground.

Shedeur Sanders completed 23-of-31 pass attempts for 233 yards with a touchdown and an interception, leading JSU to 411 yards of total offense. Dallas Daniels also caught six passes for 63 yards, while Aubrey Miller Jr. tallied a game-high 13 tackles.

Haji-Malik Williams completed 15-of-28 passes for 131 yards with a touchdown for the Camels, adding 31 yards on the ground, including a 20 yard TD scramble, leading CU to a 7-3 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Lamagea McDowell recorded a team-high 48 yards rushing, while Hill caught four passes for 33 yards.

Aaron Maddox and CJ Tillman gathered 10 tackles apiece for the Camels, while Jonathan Jones notched an interception and Josh Johnson forced a fumble, pacing a CU defense that limited Jackson State to just 2-of-14 on third downs.

**LEADING THE CAMELS**

Williams is completing nearly 63 percent of his passes for 218 yards per game with nine touchdowns, adding 275 yards rushing with five touchdowns. Bryant Barr has rushed for a team-high 382 yards and two scores, while tight end Julian Hill has hauled in 27 catches for 391 receiving yards and three touchdowns.

Linebacker CJ Tillman owns a team-high 50 tackles with a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and an interception, while Aaron Maddox owns 40 stops with an interception. Gabe Holmes has registered 36 stops, while defensive ends Brevin Allen and Josh Johnson combining for 16 tackles for loss, including 5.5 sacks.

**THE BIG SOUTH STANDINGS**

The Camels and Aggies are two of three unbeaten squads in Big South play so far this season, both at 2-0, along with Gardner-Webb, atop the league standings. Campbell will face both the Aggies and the Bulldogs over the next three weeks.

**SCOUTING THE AGGIES**

North Carolina A&T comes into Saturday's game at 4-3 on the season, winners of its last four outings, including a 38-14 victory over Robert Morris last week.

Jalen Fowler leads the Aggies, completing 66.1 percent of his passes for 905 yards, nine touchdowns and just one interception, while Bhayshul Tuten adds six rushing touchdowns with 110.9 yards per game. Tyquan King has also gathered a team-high 63 tackles with an interception, while Jermaine McDaniel has tallied team highs of 7.5 TFLs and 5.0 sacks.

Saturday will mark the first meeting between Campbell and Aggies.

**CAMELS RECEIVING TOP-25 VOTES**

For the fourth straight week, Campbell is receiving votes in the FCS Top-25.

The Camels received seven votes in this week's Stats Perform FCS Top-25 Poll, one of 10 squads earning votes in the national rankings. CU also earned a vote in last week's AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll for the first time this season.

This is the fourth different season that the Camels have received top-25 votes, also picking up tallies in 2011, 2018 and 2019.

Campbell received votes for a program record six straight weeks in 2019 between the Stats Perform and AFCA Coaches' polls. CU was also named an honorable mention FedEx Ground FCS National Team of the Week from Stats Perform earlier this season after topping previously unbeaten North Carolina Central.

**PETERSEN AGAIN NAMED BIG SOUTH SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK**

For the second time in three weeks, Campbell's Corey Petersen has been named Big South Special Teams Player of the Week.

Petersen punted a season-high seven times for 285 yards (40.7 yards per punt) at top-10 ranked Jackson State. The Traralgon, Australia native pinned the Tigers inside the 20 three times, including once on a game-long of 46 yards. Petersen has averaged 40 or more yards per punt in four straight games, and five times this season.

The graduate student was also named Big South specialist of the week on October 10 following the Camels' homecoming win over Charleston Southern. He was also recently named to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List.

On the season, Petersen is averaging 40.9 yards per punt with 10 punts downed inside the 20, plus five fair catches and four 50-plus yard boots.

**ALLEN EYES RECORDS**

Brevin Allen became Campbell's all-time tackles for loss leader in the Camels' win over Robert Morris, passing Jack Ryan's (2015-18) 36.5 TFLs. The 2021 All-American also tied CU's career sacks record of 20.5, shared with Ugonna Awuruonye (2013-15).

Allen posted three sacks along with an interception in the first half alone of Campbell's win over RMU. The redshirt senior's 3.0 sacks marked a career high, and tied for the second most in a single





**CAMELS AGAINST THE FBS**

The Camels are now 0-10 all-time against FBS opponents, following CU's 49-10 loss at East Carolina in week 3. The trip to ECU marked the program's fourth game against an in-state FBS foe (at Appalachian State 2014 and 2020, at Wake Forest 2020).

Prior to the 2020 season, Campbell had played against just four FBS opponents in its modern history, traveling to Troy in 2019 and hosting Coastal Carolina in 2018, while facing off with Old Dominion in 2013 and Appalachian State in 2014.

Although CU has never beaten an FBS opponent (0-10), the Camels nearly took down Georgia Southern in their 2020 opener in Statesboro, Ga., falling just a point short, 27-26.

Georgia Southern was Campbell's fifth game overall against an FBS squad, and third with full FBS status. When Campbell previously played at ODU and at App State, both were in the final year of the transitional phase from the FCS level. ODU played a FBS independent schedule in 2013, squaring off against five FBS members, while the Mountaineers played a full Sun Belt slate in 2014, going 6-2 in league play while winning its final six games of the year.

The Camels also played Charlotte in 2013 and 2014 when the 49ers were in the beginning stages of their transition to FBS, playing an independent FCS schedule. Campbell's 2020 finale at Wake Forest marked the program's first ever against a Power Five opponent in football.

CU opened the 2021 season at Liberty.

In its 10 games against FBS foes, Campbell held the lead in five different outings for a total of 86:57, including 44:13 in its 2020 opener at Georgia Southern, and for 14:37 at App State. CU also led Coastal for 19:07 of the first half in 2018, and made the initial score against ODU in 2013, leading for 2:39 of the first quarter.

game in school history. The interception was the first of the defensive end's career. While owning three of Campbell's six sacks on the day, Allen, a Greensboro, N.C. product, helped the Camels limit RMU to just 188 total yards, a season low for the CU defense, including only eight rushing yards, tied for the second-lowest ground total allowed in its Division I era (since 2008). CU gave up just three rushing yards in a 39-9 win at Davidson in 2015.

**SPECIAL TEAMS BEING SPECIAL**

Through seven games, Camels have been named Big South Special Teams Player of the Week five times.

All in different special teams units, place kicker Caleb Dowden was named the league's player of the week after kicking three field goals in CU's opener, and returner Josh McNeely followed with weekly honors following the Camels' trip to nationally-ranked William & Mary.

After scoring a touchdown on a blocked punt against NC Central, Jalen Kelsey was also honored. Finally, punter Corey Petersen was named the week six and week eight conference player of the week. He has also named to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List.

In addition to Campbell's special teams honors, Dowden has already tied the CU single season record for field goals with 10 (Colin Gary, 2019).

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Following a 41-10 win over Robert Morris, Campbell remains unbeaten at 4-0 at home at Barker-Lane Stadium this season. Campbell has led in 15 of its 16 quarters at home, outscoring opponents a combined 152-66.

In four home games, Campbell has rushed for 901 yards, averaging 225.3 yards per game on the ground with 10 touchdowns. The Camels ran for a season-high 315 yards with five TDs against NC Central, following up that performance with 199 yards rushing and two scores against Charleston Southern.

CU's homecoming game against CSU also marked the 24th sellout in Barker-Lane Stadium history (since 2008), and its first of the 2022 season.

Meanwhile, on the road, Campbell is 0-3 so far this season.

**NEXT UP**

Campbell wraps up a three game road stretch, heading to new Big South member Bryant on November 5. The Camels return home for their home finale on November 12 against Gardner-Webb for the 2022 North Carolina East/West Barbecue Bowl and Senior Day.

**CAMPBELL AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS**

After taking on a ranked opponent for the second time the season, Campbell is 0-9 all-time against FCS competition in the top-25, including a 0-6 mark on the road.

Last Saturday's game at No. 6/9 Jackson State was the fourth time Campbell has faced an FCS top-10 team, previously coming at then-No. 3 James Madison a season ago (L 51-14).

Campbell has faced at least one ranked opponent in each of the last four full seasons.

**WILLIAMS ON TARGET**

Against Robert Morris, Hajj-Malik Williams completed 26-of-35 passes (74.3 percent) for 249 yards and three touchdowns, all but three attempts, and two completions for 11 yards, coming in the first half.

His 74.3 completion percentage marked a career best in a game with 20 or more completions. His 26 completions were also a career high. Against NC Central, Charleston Southern and RMU, Williams completed 64-of-93 passes (68.8 percent) for 734 yards and five touchdowns with only one interception. The redshirt junior added 29 rushing yards in the win over the Colonials.

**DEFENSE POSTS NEAR RECORD DAY AGAINST COLONIALS**

Campbell limited RMU to just 188 total yards, a season low for the Camel defense, including eight rushing yards, tied for the second-lowest ground total allowed in its Division I era (since 2008). CU gave up just three rushing yards in a 39-9 win at Davidson in 2015. In the second half, the Camels held Robert Morris to just 54 yards of total offense.

**THREE FORMER MINTER ASSISTANTS COACHING IN NFL**

Three former Mike Minter assistants now hold coaching positions in the National Football League. Former Campbell assistant coaches Ben Bolling (Houston Texans), DeAndre Thompson (Denver Broncos) and Pat White (Los Angeles Chargers) are all coaching at football's highest level.

Bolling, a former record-holding wide receiver for the Camels (2011-15) and CU graduate, is in his second season in Houston as a defensive assistant after spending five years on Minter's staff.

Thompson coached Campbell's defensive backs for two seasons, 2019 and 2020, landing in Denver prior to the 2022 season.

White briefly spent time on Minter's staff as a quarterbacks coach in the spring of 2022, leaving for the Chargers in July.

**PETERSEN NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST**

Campbell's Corey Petersen has been added to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List, presented by the Augusta Sports Council.

Petersen was named to the Big South's preseason all-conference team in July, and has been named the league's special teams player of the week twice this season.

The Augusta Sports Council, also home to the Ray Guy Award (awarded to the best collegiate punter in the FBS), created the FCS Punter of the Year Award in 2019 to honor the best collegiate punter

playing in the FCS. Among the statistics used to identify the winner is net punting average, number of times punt is downed or kicked out of bounds inside the opponents 20-yard line, total yardage punted, average returned yardage and percentage of punts not returned with particular emphasis placed on net punting average. The winner must display team leadership, self-discipline and have a positive impact on the team's success.

**QB WILLIAMS MAKES HISTORY**

CU quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams became Campbell's all-time passing yards leader in his 2022 season opener, also passing the 1,000 career rushing yards milestone.

Playing in his 20th career game, Williams passed for 175 yards and a touchdown, adding 19 rushing yards against The Citadel. The Atlanta, Ga. native is now the second CU player to reach 3,000 yards passing and 1,000 rushing yards in a career (Daniel Smith 2017-18).

Williams now owns 4,944 yards passing and 1,282 rushing in his Campbell career (26 games).

A preseason All-Big South selection, he was named the league's offensive player of the week on Monday.

**THE NATION'S NO. 1 FCS RECRUITING CLASS**

During the offseason, Campbell hauled in the No. 1 ranked incoming freshmen recruiting class in the FCS. Campbell's incoming 2022 class includes 19 incoming freshmen, with 12 rated as three or four star recruits, as well as one two star prospect.

Headlining the class are a pair of four star safeties, in Myles Rowser (Detroit, Mich. / Belleville HS) and Edric Weldon (Miami, Fla. / South Broward HS), who carried a four star ranking by Rivals prior to an injury early in his senior season. The pair are among the top recruits in their class to sign with Football Championship Subdivision programs, headlining Campbell's No. 1 incoming freshman class in the NCAA's subdivision.

The Camels' class finished 78th in Rivals and 89th according to 247 Sports, as the only FCS program to finish in the top-100 of college football recruiting rankings.

**FIRST TIME OPPONENTS**

Campbell will face off against a whopping eight first time opponents over the course of the 2022 season, including in each of its first four contests, and all six of its nonconference foes.

Since the 2018 campaign, which coincided with the program moving to the Big South, CU had already faced 14 first time opponents heading into the 2022 season, with that number set to balloon to 22 by the end of this year.

New opponents on the schedule in 2022 are The Citadel (September 1), William & Mary (September 10), East Carolina (September 17), North Carolina Central (October 1), Jackson State (October 22), North Carolina A&T (October 29), Bryant (November 5) and Delaware State (November 19).

Of Campbell's 2022 opponents, the Camels have met Charleston Southern the most in their relatively brief history (since 2008), with just five all-time meetings.

**ALLEN, WILLIAMS TABBED BIG SOUTH PLAYERS OF THE WEEK (10/17)**

After leading Campbell to its third consecutive win, Hajj-Malik Williams and Brevin Allen were named Big South players of the week.

Williams was named the league's offensive player of the week for the second time in three weeks, while Allen, the Big South's 2021 Defensive Player of the Year and picked to repeat that honor in 2022, was tabbed defensive player of the week following CU's 41-10 victory over Robert Morris.

Williams completed 26-of-35 passes (74.3 percent) for 249 yards and three touchdowns against Robert Morris, while Allen posted three sacks along with an interception in the first half alone against the Colonials.

**OFFENSIVE FIREWORKS**

Campbell rolled up 516 yards of total offense in its win over the Colonials – breaking the 400-yard mark for the fourth-straight outing.

The Camels ran a school record offensive 94 plays in the win, breaking the previous record of 90 (done three previous times: Georgetown - 9/9/17, at Marist - 10/1/16, at Valparaiso - 9/28/13).

Campbell posted a season-high 563 yards of total offense against NC Central, including 315 yards rushing, both season bests, in addition to tallying 436 yards in a win over Charleston Southern.

CU went 3-1 over that time, with its only loss coming at FBS member East Carolina, where the Camels posted 403 yards, including 300 through the air.

**ROOKIE WIDE OUT BREAKS OUT**

Freshman wide receiver Chaney Fitzgerald registered a breakout game with four catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns against Robert Morris. The Kernersville native's first quarter 27-yard catch from Hajj-Malik Williams put Campbell on the board with the rookie's first career TD. Fitzgerald is the first CU freshman with two TD receptions in a game since Jalen Kelsey in 2019. He owns 13 catches for 152 yards this season.

**TILLMAN, PETERSEN EARN BIG SOUTH WEEKLY HONORS (10/10)**

After opening Big South play with a win, Campbell's CJ Tillman and Corey Petersen were named conference players of the week. Tillman has been named the Big South's defensive player of the week, while Petersen earned special teams honors.

A sophomore from Rockingham, Tillman registered a career-high 12 tackles in Campbell's 34-28 win over Charleston Southern on Saturday. The linebacker added a tackle for loss, one of a season-best nine for the Camels on the day. Tillman also returned a kickoff 15 yards, helping set up Caleb Dowden's 40-yard field goal to put CU up 24-14 just before the half.



**CAMPBELL FOOTBALL HISTORY**

Campbell has a football history that dates back to 1925 when the school fielded its first varsity team. That team led by coaches Edge and Baker went 3-1-1 including the historic first 7-0 victory over Carthage. The details of some of early teams remains incomplete, but it is known that the 1929 team, under the direction of Coach Bob Hays, posted Campbell's first-ever state championship with a 5-2-1 record.

Campbell continued to be a program to account for and posted a state junior college championship in 1932 under the guidance of Coach S.O. Brandon. The third state title came in 1939 when Campbell tied both Belmont Abbey and Brevard.

With World War II in full swing Campbell made the decision to suspend football play from 1940-45 until the war came to an end. When CU resumed play the Camels continued to win. The team won the 1946 and 1948 North Carolina Junior College State Championships and finished as the runner-up in 1947 all under the direction of Coach Earl Smith.

The 1947 team lost to South Georgia 46-7 to finish as the runner-up for the Eastern United States Junior College Championship. One year later in 1948, Campbell won the North Carolina title, but fell to familiar foe South Georgia 26-19 in the Eastern U.S. Championship.

With the on-set of the Korean Conflict and the movement of many North Carolina schools to senior college status in the 1950's, Campbell dropped its varsity football program after the 1950 season until the present day.

In August 2004, Campbell first began to explore, by way of a feasibility study, the possibility of adding non-athletic scholarship football as a varsity sport. When results came back as something that should be pursued CU made the official announcement on April 7, 2006 that football was coming back to the Creek as varsity sport in time for the 2008 season. It was decided that the program would compete at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (non-scholarship) level.

In 2006, the Camels formally submitted a bid to join the Pioneer Football League. On June 15, 2006 Dale Steele was named head coach and began to assemble his staff and his first signing class in 2007.

Steele and his staff continued their preparation for the 2008 season by conducting the team's first official football practice in more than 50 years on August 28, 2007 with more than 100 players participating.

The Pioneer Football League formally accepted Campbell's application for the 2008 season on December 5, 2007. That day also served as the official unveiling of the 2008 game schedule.

After years of planning and waiting, the Camels were finally able to take the field on August 30, 2008 with a contest against Birmingham-Southern College. In front of overflowing crowd of 5,845 CU lost a hard-fought 12-6 game.

2011 marked a banner year for the CU football program, with the team producing its first winning season since its re-launch, going 6-5 overall and 5-3 in PFL play.

On November 27, 2012, former Carolina Panthers standout Mike Minter was named head coach of the Fighting Camel program.

Campbell announced in November 2016 that it would move toward adding the full NCAA Football Championship Subdivision scholarship allotment (63) after a decade in the non-athletic scholarship PFL and join the Big South Conference in the fall of 2018.

Petersen, meanwhile, punted five times in the six point win, averaging 42.6 yards per punt. A Traralgon, Australia native, Petersen booted two punts over 50 yards, including a 53 yarder, and pinned the Buccaneers inside their own 20 three times.

**BLOCK PARTY**

The Camels' fourth quarter blocked punt returned for a touchdown against North Carolina Central was the third in Campbell history. Alex Santiago, who has now been a part of two of those three instances, blocked the punt, and Jalen Kelsey scooped up the ball at the goal line for the TD.

It was the 35th non-offensive touchdown in the program's modern era (since 2008).

Campbell ranked fourth in the FCS last season with four defensive touchdowns.

**SLADE SIGNS WITH USFL'S BREAKERS**

Former Campbell standout Darion Slade has signed with the New Orleans Breakers of the USFL. A three-time All-Big South Conference performer, Slade played in 44 career games for the Camels, making 221 tackles, third all-time in CU history. The Winston-Salem native added four career interceptions with 9.5 tackles for loss, 17 pass breakups, three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles across six seasons (2016-21).

In 2021, the safety ranked 10th in the Big South in tackles per game (6.8), collecting 61 stops for the season, including 5.0 for loss with two fumble recoveries, two interceptions, a pass breakup and a defensive touchdown.

He was the only player in the Big South with at least 60 tackles, two interceptions and two fumble recoveries, despite playing in only nine games.

The USFL regular season schedule will run April-June 2023. The Breakers went 6-4 in 2022 in the league's first season.

**CU PICKED SECOND IN BIG SOUTH PRESEASON POLL**

Campbell has been picked second in the 2022 Big South Conference Preseason Poll. With a pair of first place votes and nine total top-three votes of a possible 12, the Camels finished with 50 points, just behind North Carolina A&T, which finished with six first place tallies and 60 points.

Following the Camels were Charleston Southern and Gardner-Webb in a tie for third with 44 points. Big South newcomer Bryant (33 points) and Robert Morris (21) rounded out the poll. Five of the six league members picked up at least one first place vote.

Campbell's second place preseason nod is its highest since moving to the Big South in 2018. CU was picked fourth in 2019 and 2020, also taking fifth in 2018 and 2021. Campbell was never voted higher than fourth in a preseason poll in its previous conference, the Pioneer Football League (2008-17).

**ALLEN NAMED PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Campbell defensive end Brevin Allen has been named the 2022 Big South Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, headlining 10 CU selections on the league's preseason team.

The Camels' 10 selections leads the conference.

Quarterback Hajji-Malik Williams, tight end Julian Hill and offensive tackle Tyler McLellan, all 2021 First Team All-Big South picks, as well as special teamers in punter Corey Petersen, long snapper Jackson Hayes and Josh McNeely, who was voted to the preseason squad as both a kick and punt returner, all joined Allen on the 2022 Preseason All-Big South team, while offensive tackle Mike Edwards and safety Dorian Jones were honorable mention picks.

Allen is coming off an All-American season for the Camels in 2021, leading the Big South in sacks (9.5) and tackles for loss (17.5), while ranking in the top-20 nationally in both categories.

The 2021 Big South Defensive Player of the Year was also a finalist for the Stats Perform FCS Buck Buchanan Award, setting a Campbell single season record for sacks, while tying the program single season mark in stops for loss, adding 44 total tackles with a fumble recovery, a pass breakup and six hurries.

**15 SEASONS OF CAMPBELL FOOTBALL**

In 2021, Campbell produced three FCS All-Americans, including Big South Defensive Player of the Year Brevin Allen, who posted a record-setting season with 17.5 tackles for loss, highlighting a bevy of talent returning to Buies Creek.

Campbell returns eight starters on offense and six on the defensive side from the 2021 team, including QB Hajji-Malik Williams, a 2019 freshman All-American and 2020 Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year.

Also coming back are All-Big South performers in tight end Julian Hill and offensive tackle Tyler McLellan, as well as 2021 freshman All-American linebacker CJ Tillman.

Last season, Campbell ranked fourth in the FCS in turnovers gained (25) and defensive touchdowns (4). On the offensive side, the Camels led the Big South in passing offense at 261.6 yards per game, ranking 22nd in the FCS, setting a school record for passing yards (2,901) and passing touchdowns (24).

The Camels began their modern era of football in 2008, competing at the NCAA Division I FCS level, first in the Pioneer Football League (2008-17), and now as a Big South Conference member (2018-present).

Campbell originally fielded a football team from 1925 until 1950, suspending play from 1940-45 due to World War II, winning five North Carolina junior college state championships (1929, 1932, 1939, 1946, 1948).

**THE 10TH SEASON OF THE MINTER ERA**

Former Carolina Panthers standout and Nebraska Football Hall of Famer Mike Minter heads into his 10th season as head football coach at Campbell University in 2022.

Over the last nine seasons, Campbell has reset nearly every record in the school's books. Camels have been named first or second team all-conference 46 times, while 37 have been tabbed honorable mention all-league.

Minter led the Camels to three consecutive winning seasons from 2017-19, a modern era program first (since 2008). During the team's historic six game winning streak in 2019, Campbell received top-25 votes for five straight weeks, another program first.

Momentum continues to build for the future for the Camels with Minter at the helm. Following the 2021 season, Campbell compiled the top recruiting class in the FCS, inking three of the top-10 ranked recruits in the subdivision.

**NEW COORDINATORS TAKE OVER**

Campbell will have new coordinators on the offensive and defensive sides of the ball in 2022. Anthony Weeden takes over coordinating the CU offense, while Damien Adams and Reggie Howard were tabbed co-defensive coordinators.

Weeden heads into his second season in Buies Creek, continuing to coach the CU wide receivers in addition to his new duties after helping the Camels lead the Big South in passing offense at 261.6 yards per game in 2021.

Adams, who will serve in his 10th season on Minter's staff in 2022, will continue to coach the CU defensive line. He was named defensive run game coordinator following the 2018 season. Howard, a former Carolina Panther, came to Campbell as the defensive backs coach prior to the 2021 season, will continue to coach CU's defensive backs in addition to his coordinator duties.

Minter also revamped his offensive coaching staff with the additions of Pat White (quarterbacks), Famika Anae (offensive line) and Dee Brown (running backs), while promoting Patrick Miller (safeties) on the defensive side.

**ALLEN, EDWARDS NAMED TO SHRINE BOWL 1000**

Campbell defensive end Brevin Allen and offensive tackle Mike Edwards have both been named to the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000.

The list is compiled from all four levels of football in consultation with NFL and college personnel to put together the best 1000 players for the NFL level, with the aim for the Shrine Bowl 1000 to serve as a look into the scouting process, as well as to begin to preview college players who are currently all-star game eligible for the 2023 East-West Shrine Bowl and 2023 NFL Draft class.

About the East-West Shrine Bowl: Since 1925, the East-West Shrine Bowl has benefited Shriners Children's and its mission to provide advanced care for children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families' ability to pay for services.

The East-West Shrine Bowl is the longest running college all-star football game in the nation. The East-West Shrine Bowl is an important part of America's football tradition, giving top college players a chance to showcase their talents to NFL scouts and a national television audience.

For more than 90 years, some of football's greatest athletes and coaches have contributed to the tradition of the East-West Shrine Bowl. Players like Gale Sayers, Tom Brady, John Elway, Allan Page, Dick Butkus, Brett Favre, Gino Marchetti and Walter Payton, along with coaches Don Shula, Dick Vermeil, Paul "Bear" Bryant and Jerry Glanville, to name a few, have supported the East-West Shrine Bowl.

**CAMPBELL'S BLAKE RECEIVES WILMA RUDOLPH STUDENT-ATHLETE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**

Campbell senior offensive lineman Austin Blake has been presented with the 2022 Wilma Rudolph Student-Athlete Achievement Award by the National Association of Academic and Student-Athlete Development Professionals (N4A).

The N4A Wilma Rudolph Student-Athlete Achievement Award honors student-athletes who have overcome great personal, academic, and/or emotional odds to achieve academic success while participating in intercollegiate athletics. These individuals have persevered and made significant personal strides toward success.

Austin arrived at Campbell University and immediately made an impact on the football field. However, in 2020, Austin was diagnosed with Guillain-Barre Syndrome (GBS), a rare autoimmune disorder that damages nerves. He spent three to four months at Shepherd Center, where he endured a very intense rehab schedule to relearn basic human movements and functions. Austin experienced some complications from GBS, including being diagnosed with CIDP, a chronic form of BS, but he continued to fight to get back on the field.

Even though he spent a majority of that semester in outpatient rehab, he completed coursework so he would not fall behind in his classes. When he got back to school, he decided to change his major to healthcare management so he could one day start his own rehab facility. By the 2021 season, Austin was back on the football field.

He was honored along with fellow 2022 Wilma Rudolph recipients Riley Clark, University of Maine; Mary Griffin, Virginia Tech; Taylor Robertson, University of Dayton; and Jack Winkler, Michigan State University in conjunction with the 2022 N4A Convention on June 27.

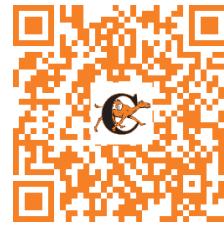

Former Carolina Panthers standout and Nebraska Football Hall of Famer Mike Minter heads into his 10th season as head football coach at Campbell University in 2022.

Over the last nine seasons, Campbell has reset nearly every record in the school's books. Camels have been named first or second team all-conference 46 times, while 37 have been tabbed honorable mention all-league.

Minter led the Camels to three consecutive winning seasons from 2017-19, a modern era program first (since 2008). During the team's historic six game winning streak in 2019, Campbell received top-25 votes for five straight weeks, another program first. CU also improved to 3-3 in conference play in its second Big South season.

Nine Camels took Big South postseason honors in 2019, led by Offensive Freshman of the Year quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams, and offensive lineman Jacob Cuddington, linebacker Justice Galloway-Velazquez and defensive back Darion Slade all earning first team all-conference nods. Additionally, two Camels claimed All-America honors, with Williams being named First Team HERO Sports Freshman All-American, while Galloway-Velazquez was tabbed honorable mention Sophomore All-America.

The Camels played an abbreviated four-game, all-FBS schedule in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, taking on Georgia Southern, Coastal Carolina, Appalachian State and Wake Forest. Among the milestones set during the 21-day, four game season, Campbell received unprecedented national attention with three nationally televised games, including a Friday night matchup at Coastal Carolina on ESPN.

Following the Camels' near-upset at Georgia Southern to open 2020, CU earned Stats Perform FCS Team of the Week honors, while QB Hajj-Malik Williams was named the FCS Player of the Week.

The CU defense again impressed in spite of the tough schedule, ranking No. 2 among FCS programs in pass defense in the fall.

Despite not participating in the spring of 2021, four Camels were named to All-Big South teams, including defensive lineman Brevin Allen, tight end Julian Hill, offensive lineman Tyler McLellan and defensive back Darion Slade, all tabbed second team all-conference.

In 2021, Minter coached three FCS All-Americans, including Big South Defensive Player of the Year Brevin Allen, who posted a record-setting season, as well as wide receiver Caleb Snead, who finished his CU career as the program's all-time leading receiver. Rookie linebacker CJ Tillman was also named Freshman All-America.

Allen headlined six Camels on the league's 2021 all-conference teams, joined by Snead, tight end Julian Hill and offensive tackle Tyler McLellan as First Team All-Big South honorees, while defensive back Darion Slade and kick returner Josh McNeely were tabbed second team all-conference.

Defensively, Campbell ranked fourth in the FCS in turnovers gained (25) and defensive touchdowns (4) at season's end. On the offensive side, the Camels led the Big South in passing offense at 261.6 yards per game, ranking 22nd in the FCS, setting a school record for passing yards (2,901) and passing touchdowns (24) this season.

Following the 2021 season, Campbell compiled the top recruiting class in the FCS through the December early signing period, inking three of the top-10 ranked recruits in the subdivision.

Minter led the Camels through a successful transition to the Big South Conference in 2018, their first season as a scholarship program. Campbell finished 2018 at 6-5 overall and 1-4 in its inaugural Big South season.

For the third straight season, Campbell broke its overall attendance record (35,405) in 2018, while resetting Barker-Lane Stadium's single-game mark with 6,712 for its Homecoming tilt vs. Gardner-Webb.

Minter picked up his first win as a collegiate head coach in his home debut as the Camels cruised to a 56-21 triumph over UVA-Wise.

Minter, a member of two national championship teams at Nebraska and the Panthers' 2003 Super Bowl squad, joined the Fighting Camel program after serving as assistant coach at Liberty University in 2012 and Johnson C. Smith University in 2011. He also brought head coaching experience from First Assembly Christian School in Concord, where he guided his teams to 33 victories and two state titles in three seasons.

During his 10-year NFL career, Minter earned a starting safety role six games into his rookie year in 1997, and held that position until he retired after the 2006 season. A second-round draft choice, he helped lead the Panthers to three playoff trips, the 2003 NFC Championship and a berth in Super Bowl XXXVII.

In the Super Bowl against the New England Patriots, Minter suffered a broken left foot in the third quarter, but remained in the game and collected a career-high 18 tackles. At the time of his retirement, he held Panthers franchise records for starts (141), consecutive starts (94), fumble recoveries (11) and interceptions returned for touchdowns (4). In 2019, Minter was named to the Panthers' Silver Season Team, recognizing the best players from each position in the team's 25 years of play.

Prior to Campbell, Minter's previous college coaching stops came at Liberty, where he was the Flames' special teams coordinator/assistant defensive coach, and Johnson C. Smith as the assistant head coach, defensive passing game coordinator and special teams coordinator.

Minter was a two-time national champion at Nebraska (1994 and 1995) where he played linebacker, free safety and strong safety for the Cornhuskers. He was a three-time all-conference performer and was inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 2006. He graduated in 1997 with a Bachelor of Science degree in engineering.

Born Jan. 15, 1974, in Cleveland, Ohio, Minter led the State of Oklahoma in rushing yards (1,589) as a senior at Lawton High School in 1991. He was an all-state performer, National Honor Society member and also averaged 21 points per game on the Lawton basketball team.

Minter and his wife Kim have four children – Michael Jr., Isaiah, McKenna and Brianna.





**GRADS ON THE GRIDIRON**

Campbell's 2022 roster features 21 student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and will be playing college football this fall while pursuing additional diplomas. That number is the fourth-most in the FCS, trailing only Chattanooga (25), Southeastern Louisiana (23) and Southern Illinois (23).
