A&T: The Aggies are back in the Celebration Bowl. On Saturday, they will participate in the fifth edition of the Celebration Bowl. It will be their fourth time playing in the game. The Aggies are 3-0 in their previous three visits including two wins over Alcorn State. The Aggies have won their three Celebration Bowls by a combined 16 points.

A&T Coach Sam Washington: (MVSU '82). Washington is 18-5 (.783) as the Aggies head coach in his second season. In his rookie season as a head coach, Washington was named the 2018 MEAC Coach of the Year after leading the Aggies to a MEAC title and a Celebration Bowl victory. Washington is off to the best two-year start of any football coach in A&T history.

Alcorn: The Braves are also multiple returners to the Celebration Bowl as they will make their third appearance in five years. The Braves are known for forcing teams into making mistakes. They lead the nation in interceptions and turnovers gained. Offensively, they average 158.3 rushing yards per game.

Alcorn Fred McNair: He is in his fourth season with the Braves. McNair has led the Braves to the SWAC championship game in each of his first four seasons. The Braves have won the last two SWAC titles both over the Southern Jaguars. McNair has a career 30-18 record. He is a former Braves quarterback and played QB professionally.

AGGIES GO AFTER 4-0 RECORD IN THE CELEBRATION BOWL

- ▶ North Carolina A&T brings the No. 1 defense in the nation into Atlanta Saturday to face the Alcorn State Braves. The Aggies also only allow 76.4 rushing yards per game, which is fourth-best in the nation.
- ▶ The Aggies will try to use their defense to win their third straight HBCU national championship and their fourth in five years.
- ▶ The last team to be recognized as three-time HBCU national champions was Winston-Salem State from 2011-13.
- ▶ The Aggies are coming off a 54-0 drubbing of their archrival N.C. Central where they had more points than the Eagles had total yards (9).
- ▶ The Aggies lead the MEAC in total defense and rush defense. The Aggies have led the conference in total defense the past five seasons and six out of the last eight.
- ▶ N.C. A&T has also led the conference in rush defense the past five seasons and eight out of the last nine.
- ▶ This season, the Aggies have been well-rounded. They lead the conference in scoring offense, total offense and rushing offense to go along with leading the MEAC in rushing defense and total defense. The Aggies are second in the league in passing defense.
- ▶ North Carolina A&T running back Jah-Maine Martin finished seventh in the national voting for the Walter Payton Award given to the best offensive player on the Division I-subdivision level.
- ▶ Martin received four first-place votes and 13 second-place votes and finished with a total of 124 points. The top-4 getters were invited to the award presentation scheduled for Jan. 10, 2020 in Frisco, Texas.
- ▶ Martin has taken down two school records set by all-time great Tarik Cohen. Martin's 21 rushing touchdowns is a single-season school record once held by Cohen who rushed for 18 TD's in 2016. Martin also took down the Aggies single-season total touchdowns record once held by Cohen who had 19 in 2016.
- ▶ Martin, who leads the nation in yards per carry (7.81), is a finalist for the Black College Football Player of the Year (The Deacon Jones Award).
- ▶ The Aggies added to their collection of college graduates on the team last weekend as cornerbacks Mac McCain III and Derrek Williams, running back Darius Graves, linebacker Elijah Westbrook and wide receiver Ron Hunt received their undergraduate degrees at the Greensboro Coliseum.

Postgame Interviews

After a brief cooling off period, requested A&T players and head coach Sam Washington will be available in the Bryan Fitness & Wellness multi-purpose room for a 20-25 minute interview period. The Aggies locker room is closed to the media after games. Representatives from the communications office will take player requests from the media during the fourth quarter.

AGGIES DOMINATE MEAC LINEMAN AWARD

- ▶ The Aggies have received at least one MEAC player of the year superlative each year except for 2012 since the 2011. The Aggies have won an impressive six player of the year awards.
- ▶ N.C. A&T has won offensive lineman of the year five straight seasons including in 2019 when Marcus Pettiford claimed the award.
- ▶ Current Oakland Raider Brandon Parker won the award three straight seasons (2015-17) and Micah Shaw won the honor in 2018.
- ▶ Pettiford played 521 snaps this season and finished with a total grade of 88 percent. He missed only five assignments and recorded 27 knockdown blocks.
- ▶ He committed only one penalty (false start) in 2019.

RUIZ RETURNS FOR RECORD-BREAKING SEASON

- ▶ Junior placekicker Noel Ruiz made just 5-for-10 field goals last season and spent the offseason trying to become a more reliable kicker.
- ▶ Ruiz was named first-team All-MEAC and BoxToRow All-American after making 21 of his 25 field goals and making 39 of his 44 extra points.
- ▶ Ruiz connected on a school-record 52-yard field goal as time expired to beat Elon 24-21 on Aug. 31.
- ▶ Ruiz's 21 FG's are a single-season school record.
- ▶ Ruiz leads the nation in field goals per game (1.91), 12th in scoring (102 points), 96th in points responsible for and fifth in field goal percentage (.840).
- ▶ He is second in the MEAC behind teammate Jah-Maine Martin in scoring while leading all MEAC kickers in scoring.
- ▶ He also leads the MEAC in FG's made and FG percentage.
- ▶ Ruiz's 25 field goal attempts is also a single-season school record.
- ▶ He was 8-for-8 on field goals from 29 yards or fewer and 7-for-8 on field goals inside 39 yards.

MARTIN BECOMES RUNNING BACK U MEMBER

- ▶ North Carolina A&T has long had a tradition of producing great running backs.
- ▶ Junior running back Jah-Maine Martin fits right in. Against S.C. State, he became the ninth different running back in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season.
- ▶ It is the 15th time in the past 27 seasons and the ninth time in 10 seasons the Aggies have produced a 1,000-yard rusher.
- ▶ In his junior season, Martin took over for two-time 1,000-yard rusher Marquell Cartwright.
- ▶ But the Aggies RB tradition did not start with Cartwright, Martin or even current Chicago Bear Tarik Cohen.
- ▶ The Aggies consists of 11 gentlemen who have been on NFL rosters. Eleven times in Aggies history, an Aggies tailback has had a 1,000-yard season. An amazing 12 Aggies have averaged 5.0 yards per carry or more for their respective careers (300 or more carries).
- ▶ The legacy of Aggie RBs is so rich, it even includes College Baseball Hall of Famer Al Holland.
- ▶ The modern-day Running Back U is believed to have started with James Fisher and Bob "Stonewall" Jackson in the late 40's and early 50's.
- ▶ Jackson and Fisher led the Aggies to the 1950 Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association title in 1950.
- ▶ Fisher averaged 5.6 yards per carry and scored seven touchdowns. Jackson, a fullback, was drafted by the New York Giants in 1950.
- ▶ J.D. Smith, Jr., was the first legend. After compiling more than 1,500 rushing yards and 21 touchdowns as an Aggie, Smith was drafted by the Chicago Bears in 1955.
- ▶ George Ragsdale, who played for Washington and Tampa Bay, took over the duties in the 70's along with Holland.

RUNNING BACK U CONTINUED

- ▶ Smith is more known as a San Francisco 49er where he was a two-time Pro Bowler and ranks sixth all-time in rushing for the franchise.
- ▶ In the 80's and 90's Bill Hayes introduced the Wing-T to Aggies football and it produced the Aggies first 1,000-yard rusher in James White.
- ▶ It also produced 1,000-yard backs Milton Shaw, Maurice Smith and Maurice Hicks.
- ▶ In fact Hicks rushed for 2,812 yards in only 20 games played including a 437-yard game against Morgan State in 2000. Smith would go on to build a career with the Atlanta Falcons, while Hicks went on to be a successful running back for the 49ers.
- ▶ Then of course Cohen stepped on the scene and broke the MEAC rushing record at 5,619 yards.

BELL CHASES MEAC GLORY

- ▶ Now that senior Elijah Bell has broken A&T's career records for touch-down receptions (31), receiving yards (2,907) and receptions (200), he now has his sights on MEAC records.
- ▶ He became the Aggies all-time leader in TD receptions with a remarkable 5-yard catch against Elon on Aug. 31. He then became the Aggies all-time leader in receiving yards with a 42-yard reception at Charleston Southern on Sept. 14.
- ▶ Against Norfolk State on Oct. 5, he caught a pass on a short out route to get the school record for most career catches. Bell, the 2016 MEAC Rookie of the Year, posted a freshman record 631 receiving yards and eight touchdowns. His 953 yards receiving as a sophomore was the second-best single season performance in school history.
- ▶ He needs two yards to move into the top-5 all-time on the MEAC list ahead of FAMU's Cainon Lamb.
- ▶ Bell needs 93 yards receiving to become only the fifth MEAC player to have 3,000 career receiving yards.
- ▶ He is the sixth player in MEAC history to have 200 career receptions. Bell has eight career 100-yard receiving games and 20 games with five or more catches.

ANTOINE WILDER TO MISS THE CELEBRATION BOWL

- ▶ North Carolina A&T will be without starting rover Antoine Wilder on Saturday after Wilder broke his ankle in practice two weeks ago.
- ▶ Missing Wilder will be huge for the Aggies. Last season, Wilder led the Aggies in tackles with 67 stops and was named second-team All-MEAC.
- ▶ Last season, Wilder played weak-side linebacker but at the start of this season he was moved to the rover position, a combo linebacker/safety position where he made 48 tackles, intercepted one pass and defended four passes.
- ▶ Wilder started having problems with his ankle on Nov. 2 when he had to leave the S.C. State game early because of an injured ankle. He missed the Morgan State and Bethune-Cookman games the following weeks before returning to play against N.C. Central.
- ▶ Wilder came to the Aggies in 2018 after transferring from the University of South Carolina. Wilder is from Atlanta.

BIG-GAME CARTER

- ▶ At the start of the season, quarterback Kyllil Carter had to step in for perhaps the most successful QB in MEAC history in Lamar Raynard after Raynard won three HBCU national championships, went to four straight postseasons and the Aggies won four MEAC titles during his time at A&T.
- ▶ Carter is completing 54 percent of his passes and ranks fourth in the MEAC in total offense (212.6 per game). He is also 10th in the league in rushing yards per game (43.9). He has only four career INTs in 403 career pass attempts.
- ▶ Carter is no stranger to the lineup. This will be the fourth Celebration Bowl he is associated with in his career. He earned valuable time behind Raynard in his career including a crucial game-winning toss against S.C. State in 2015. He also helped the Aggies upset ECU last season by throwing two fourth-quarter touchdown passes to lead A&T to a 28-23 win.
- ▶ Carter was also instrumental in the Aggies upset win over Kent State in 2016 by throwing a touchdown pass and rushing for 32 yards on 11 carries.
- ▶ Carter missed last season's game against Alcorn after sustaining serious injuries in an automobile accident.

THE PETTIFORD JOURNEY TO GREATNESS

- ▶ Marcus Pettiford is one of the best offensive lineman on the FCS level.
 - ▶ Prior to the 2019 season, he has already earned preseason All-American honors from STATS, Phil Steele Magazine HERO Sports and BoxToRow.
 - ▶ He enters the 2019 season a two-time first-team All-MEAC selection and he was named first-team preseason All-MEAC for 2019.
 - ▶ But Pettiford almost missed out on all of those accolades. Pettiford, a 6-foot-4, 283-pound Durham native, was an instant standout when he arrived in Greensboro in 2015.
 - ▶ He started at right tackle as a true freshman leading the Aggies to a MEAC title and a HBCU national championship.
 - ▶ But Pettiford ran into academic issues as he was preparing to enter his sophomore season. He did not have the grades to return to A&T and therefore had to return home to Durham.
 - ▶ He sat out the 2016 season and work his way back on the team through summer school. He also received help from a learning specialist the university hired through an NCAA grant.
 - ▶ Pettiford returned and secured a 3.32 -grade point average for 2017, worked his way back on the team and helped the Aggies win back-to-back MEAC and HBCU titles.
- ### THREE AGGIES RETURN TO FOURTH CELEBRATION BOWL
- ▶ There are three Aggies who will return to their fourth Celebration Bowl. Two of those Aggies earned playing time in the first-ever Celebration Bowl.
 - ▶ Pettiford earned a start in the game at right tackle as a freshman. Pettiford helped Tarik Cohen rush for 295 yards in the game.
 - ▶ Quarterback Kyllil Carter played in the 2015 game as a freshman where he completed two out of his six passes for 28 yards and an interception.
 - ▶ Backup punter James Mackey was also on the roster in 2015.



THE LAST TIME OUT/vs. ALCORN

- ▶ The Aggies blew out their heated rival for the second straight season as they defeated the Eagles 54-0.
- ▶ It was the Aggies third straight win over the Eagles. The Aggies 54 points marked the first time in the 91-game history that either team exceeded 50 points.
- ▶ It was also the biggest blowout in series history. The Aggies have out-scored the Eagles 99-0 over the past two seasons and 123-10 over the past three seasons.
- ▶ For the second straight season, the Aggies had more points than the Eagles had total yards (9).
- ▶ For the sixth straight season, the game had postseason implications.
- ▶ Running back Jah-Maine Martin had 122 yards rushing and two touchdowns against the Eagles. It marked his sixth 100-yard game of the season and it marked the sixth time he has scored multiple touchdowns in a game this season.
- ▶ Elijah Bell had another terrific game against N.C. Central. He had three catches for 109 yards receiving and two touchdowns. In his career, Bell made 20 catches for 617 yards receiving and six touchdowns.
- ▶ The Aggies held the Eagles to negative yards rushing for the second straight season and the Eagles have not scored against the Aggies in nine quarters.
- ▶ The Aggies will now face an Alcorn State team who have won three straight.
- ▶ A year ago, the Braves tore into the Aggies stellar run defense by rushing for 328 yards and two touchdowns on 39 carries.
- ▶ It was the most rushing yards the Aggies have surrendered since head coach Sam Washington came to N.C. A&T as its defensive coordinator in 2011.
- ▶ The Braves held the Aggies to just 38 yards rushing but the Aggies did throw for 286 yards.

MAC MCCAIN III

THE BIG MAC ATTACK

- ▶ Franklin "Mac" McCain III has plenty of legacy behind his name. But he is starting to make a name for himself.
- ▶ McCain is a junior on the field, but he has already secured his undergraduate degree because he played high school football at Dudley but was a part of N.C. A&T's Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) program that allows students to earn college credits while in high school.
- ▶ McCain satisfied his requirements to earn his undergraduate degree over the summer in agricultural business.
- ▶ Last week, he participated in graduation ceremonies at the Greensboro Coliseum becoming the third generation McCain to graduate from N.C. A&T after his father and grandfather.
- ▶ McCain is in graduate school trying to earn his Master's degree in agricultural business. When his football playing days are over, McCain wants to work for the U.S. Department of Agricultural or some other food industry.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

- ▶ The name Franklin McCain holds a lot of lore at N.C. A&T. Franklin McCain and three other N.C. A&T students staged a sit-in at the Woolworth's lunch counter in Greensboro on Feb. 1, 1960 to protest the store's policy of refusing to serve black customers.
- ▶ The foursome went on to be known as the Greensboro Four and are credited with ushering in the modern-day civil rights movement.
- ▶ McCain, who died in 2013, has a monument created in his honor along with the other Greensboro Four in Ezell Blair (now Jibreel Khazan), Joseph McNeil and David Richmond.
- ▶ McCain's grandson sophomore Franklin McCain III better known as Mac is creating his own legacy at A&T.
- ▶ McCain was placed on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch for best defensive player in the nation. He was also listed as a preseason All-American. He was also on the Deacon Jones Award Watch List for best black college football player.
- ▶ As a freshman, McCain was a third-team AP All-American and a Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American.

DOING CHICKEN

- ▶ The Aggies have a couple of sayings that have sustained them during their run.
- ▶ One of those sayings is "we just do chicken."
- ▶ Former Aggies head coach Rod Broadway came up with the saying prior to the Aggies 2015 game against his alma mater, the University of North Carolina.
- ▶ When asked if the Aggies plan do anything different against the Tar Heels considering they were an ACC team with many more financial resources, Broadway compared his football team to KFC.
- ▶ "We're like KFC," he said. "We don't do burgers, we don't do fish, we do chicken. I understand KFC does gizzards, so we might throw in some gizzards every once in a while. But for the most part, we do chicken."
- ▶ So what is doing chicken all about?
- ▶ A&T is going to protect the football, stop the run and win the kicking game. That's doing chicken. From Broadway to Sam Washington, that philosophy will never change. Therefore, the Aggies do chicken.
- ▶ Another saying that has gotten traction is the mantra, "When something bad happens, keep playing. When something good happens, keep playing."
- ▶ There are ups and downs and adversity throughout a football game and life. Therefore, you must keep playing.

COACH WASHINGTON'S GREAT START

- ▶ Before A&T head coach Sam Washington's second season is even over, he is already off to the best two-year start of any Aggies head coach in history.
- ▶ Washington is 18-5 in his second season at A&T. In his first two seasons, Hornsby Howell won 14 games. Rod Broadway won 12 games over his first two seasons and Bill Hayes won seven games over his first two years.

OUT FOR THE SEASON

- ▶ A&T is looking to claim their eighth straight winning season and another bid to the Celebration Bowl despite missing some key players throughout the season.
- ▶ The Aggies have been without 2018 Celebration Bowl Defensive MVP Richie Kittles all season after he sustained an offseason knee injury that required surgery.
- ▶ In 2018, Kittles made 40 tackles (24 unassisted) with 5.5 tackles for loss, three pass breakups and one interception. Kittles will be looking for another year of eligibility.
- ▶ Also, before the season the Aggies lost senior wide receiver Ron Hunt. Hunt has been out all season but returned to play against Morgan State.
- ▶ Hunt was a key receiver for the Aggies in 2018. He made 22 catches for 340 yards and two touchdowns last season.
- ▶ Hunt's return to the field this season is questionable. He never took a redshirt, so he can return next season if he chooses.
- ▶ The Aggies lost backup running back Darius Graves for the season to a knee injury. Graves was injured at Duke on Sept. 7.
- ▶ Graves will be looking for another year of eligibility from the NCAA. Kashon Baker has stepped in for him this season.
- ▶ Cornerback Derrek Williams has also been out since the Duke game. Chris Moseley, Amir McNeill and Jabari Butler have filled in nicely for Williams in his absence.

YOUNG BACKERS LEAD A&T'S DEFENSE

- ▶ North Carolina A&T may have the best young linebacker corps in the MEAC. The good news it looks like they will have them for a long time.
- ▶ Inside linebacker Kyin Howard is a sophomore. He leads the Aggies in tackles with 70 (39 unassisted) and he has posted three double-figure tackle games. Howard earned second-team All-MEAC honors.
- ▶ Freshman linebacker Jacob Roberts was also a second-team All-MEAC selection and was placed on the Jerry Rice Watch List.
- ▶ Sophomore Joseph Stuckey mainly played special teams as a freshman leading the Aggies in special team tackles. This season he is second on the team in tackles with 65 tackles (39 unassisted). He was also a second-team All-MEAC selection.
- ▶ The Aggies also brought in junior college transfer Alex Fumbah. Fumbah is fifth on the team in tackles with 47 (25 unassisted).

WINNING SEASONS

- ▶ After the Aggies win over S.C. State on Nov. 2, they were guaranteed their eighth straight winning season.
- ▶ The longest streak of winning seasons for the Aggies is 10. It occurred from 1955-1964 starting with coach William "Bill" Bell and ending with Bert Piggot. The Aggies current streak is the second-highest in school history and the longest such current streak in the

THE GREATEST DEFENSE ON EARTH

- ▶ A&T never has a player with an enormous amount of tackles or a player with big interception numbers, but what they do have is one of the most consistent defenses the nation has seen over the past nine years.
- ▶ The Aggies were once again one of the best defenses in the nation. For seven years (2011-17), their defense was ran by Sam Washington. Washington became the Aggies head coach in 2018 leading the way for Courtney Coard to become the co-defensive coordinator.
- ▶ The tradition has continued under Coard. The Aggies have led the MEAC in total defense the past five seasons.
- ▶ A&T has led the MEAC in rush defense in eight out of the last nine seasons.
- ▶ The Aggies have had the best scoring defense in the league three straight years. Nationally, the Aggies have finished outside the top-10 in total defense only twice in the past nine years.
- ▶ In the last eight years nationally, A&T has finished now lower than 18th in total defense.
- ▶ The Aggies have finished in the top-10 in rush defense nationally eight out of the last nine years.
- ▶ During the Aggies current run of successful defenses, they have had only two players record 100 tackles in a season.
- ▶ D'Vonte Grant and Brian Houston had 102 and 100 tackles respectively in 2013.

N.C. A&T HEAD FOOTBALL COACH SAM WASHINGTON



Sam Washington became the 19th head football coach in North Carolina A&T State history on January 9, 2018. Washington also serves as the Aggies co-defensive coordinator.

In his first season as the Aggies head coach, Washington led N.C. A&T to its 10th MEAC championship. Also in his first season, Washington led the Aggies to their second straight Celebration Bowl victory and their third in four years. The Aggies were also named HBCU national champions in Washington's first season as the Aggies finished 2018 10-2. For his efforts, Washington became the second N.C. A&T rookie coach to capture MEAC coach of the year as he tied the school record for wins by a first-year coach.

Prior to being promoted to head coach, Washington served as the Aggies defensive coordinator and secondary coach for seven years under legendary head coach Rod Broadway. In 2015, he was promoted to associate head coach. He has established himself as one of the best defensive minds in Division I-FCS.

Under Washington, the Aggies have finished out the top-20 in total defense only once nationally. In two of those seasons, they were second nationally in total defense. The run defense has finished outside the top-10 nationally

only once including leading the nation in run defense in 2013.

In three of Washington's eight seasons, the Aggies have finished among the top-10 teams in passing defense efficiency including No. 1 in 2012. The Aggies have been the MEAC's No. 1 total defense and scoring defense five times in the past eight years. They have had the No. 1 total defense in the conference four straight seasons. N.C. A&T has also had the No. 1 rush defense in the conference seven times in eight years.

In his role as the secondary coach, seven different cornerbacks have earned All-MEAC success in D'Vonte Graham, Justin Ferrell, Tony McRae, Donald Mattocks, Marquis Boyan,

Timadre Abram and Frank "Mac" McCain III with only Boyan not earning first-team honors. Graham, McRae, Mattocks and McCain have all earned All-American honors from various organizations. Two of Washington's corners – McRae and Ayodeji Olatoye – spent multiple seasons on NFL rosters.

Olatoye made the Dallas Cowboys 53-man roster in 2015 and playing the Super Bowl in 2017. McRae has played the past two seasons for the Cincinnati Bengals and started a game in 2018.

Before arriving at A&T, Washington spent four seasons as Grambling's defensive backs coach under Broadway. Washington played a significant role in the Tigers' dominating defense in 2007. Nationally, the Tigers ranked 12th in total defense. The next season, Grambling led the nation in turnover margin and was third in scoring defense. Defensive back Desmond Lenard was ninth in the nation in interceptions per game. Three other defensive backs ranked among the Top-50 in interceptions per game that season.

Before Washington came to Grambling, he spent five years at his alma mater Mississippi Valley State. Washington served as an assistant head coach and

defensive coordinator in addition to his customary role as the defensive backs coach. In his first season at MVSU, he transformed the Delta Devils defense from one of the worst defenses in the SWAC into the league's No. 2 ranked defense.

Before returning to MVSU, Washington spent one season (2001) as N.C. A&T's special teams coordinator under head coach Bill Hayes. Under Washington, the Aggies had one of the best special teams seasons in school history. The Aggies led the nation in punt return yardage per game with punt returner Curtis Deloatch breaking the NCAA's single-season record for punt return touchdowns. Punter Yonnick Matthews was second in the MEAC in punting.

Washington also spent eight seasons at N.C. Central as the school's assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. Led by All-American Buddy Crutchfield, Adrian Jones and Trei Oliver in 1996, Washington put together one of the best Division II defensive backfields as the Eagles went 8-3 with the best pass defense in the CIAA. In 1992, he began work at Johnson C. Smith. He was named the assistant head coach. His other duties included being the defensive and special teams coordinator, the defensive backs coach and the head track and field coach.

Washington's coaching profession also includes a stint with Bethune-Cookman (1987-92), where he helped the Wildcats take a share of the 1988 MEAC championship. In 1998, he secured an internship

with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers under legendary head coach Tony Dungy.

Washington spent four seasons in the NFL with stops in Pittsburgh and Cincinnati. As a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Washington intercepted at least one pass in five consecutive games during the 1984 season. Before making it to the NFL, Washington played cornerback for Mississippi Valley State where he battled daily in practice with a wide receiver named Jerry Rice.

Washington earned a B.S., degree in physical education from MVSU in 1982. He was inducted into the MVSU Hall of Fame in 2006. He and his wife Donna have one son, Jarvis.

EAST GREENSBORO - The biggest scare for North Carolina A&T head football coach Sam Washington was not junior Noel Ruiz's game-winning 52-yard field goal as time expired that downed No. 21 Elon 24-21 Saturday night at BB&T Stadium. Despite Ruiz missing two prior field goals in the game, Washington has witnessed Ruiz hit 50 yarders plenty of times in practice.

The scariest part for Washington was the play that happened before the field goal attempt. The 19th-ranked Aggies nearly ran the clock out on the previous play which would have sent the game into overtime.

Instead, a play that started with nine seconds remaining in the game and included graduate quarterback Kyll Carter scramble around the field before tossing a pass downfield that Korey Banks caught out of bounds, left one second on the clock.

There was enough time for Ruiz to boot the game-winner despite missing from 43 and 40 yards earlier in the game. Washington said he did not even watch the play that ended with Banks landing out of bounds because he was too busy see if the clock was going to tick down to zero. The one second remaining on the clock allowed Ruiz to make history. His 52-yard field goal tied a school record first set by Yonnick Mathews on Sept. 27, 2003 at Elon. It was the Aggies first 50-yard field goal since Carlos Davalos hit a 50-yarder in Raleigh to beat N.C. Central in 2004. Ruiz also has the Aggies first game-winning field goal since Davalos' kick against NCCU.

All three of Ruiz's attempts had plenty of leg and they all occurred in the fourth quarter with the game tied at 21. His first missed kick went wide left and left the game tied with 10:07 remaining. The second missed kick also went to left leaving 2:35 on the clock.

DURHAM - When you have the type of success the North Carolina A&T program has had over the past decade it is easy to forget the team that defeated them 45-13 on Saturday night at Wallace Wade Stadium is from a Power Five conference called the ACC and their name is Duke.

While not the in the elite category of their men's basketball team, the Blue Devils have won three straight bowl games, had a quarterback drafted in the top-10 of the NFL Draft last spring and they have all the advantages that come with being Duke.

Despite being major underdogs on Saturday, however, the Aggies did take the lead twice before the final three minutes of the second half derailed any hopes they had of upsetting the Blue Devils.

N.C. A&T scored the first points of the game after stopping the Blue Devils on 4th-and-1 from the Duke 40-yard line. Seven plays later, junior placekicker Noel Ruiz booted a 40-yard field goal to give the Aggies a 3-0 first-quarter lead with 7:14 remaining in the first quarter.

Duke took their first lead 75 seconds later as Quentin Harris took advantage of an Aggies defensive back failing to connect with Jalon Calhoun for a 38-yard touchdown pass. N.C. A&T, who came into the game with three wins over Division I-FBS programs in three years, started to give the Aggie faithful hope they would take down the biggest giant of them all as junior running back Jah-Maine Martin ran 66 yards for a touchdown to give the Aggies a 10-7 lead four minutes into the second quarter.

CHARLESTON, S.C. - There is truly a tradition of greatness at the running back position at a university when 299 yards rushing is the third-best single-game performance in the football program's history.

Junior running back Jah-Maine Martin added to the lore that is Running Back U., at N.C. A&T by rushing for 299 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Aggies to a come-from-behind 27-21 win over Charleston Southern Saturday night at Buccaneer Field.

Former Aggie running back Maurice Hicks holds the best two performances with a then NCAA record 437 yards rushing at Morgan State in 2001 and 353 yards rushing against S.C. State in 2000.

Martin's two touchdowns went for 84 and 76 yards respectively. His 84-yard run is the fifth-best in school history tied with Tarik Cohen (2016) and Michael Basnight (1996).

Martin's spectacular night and the Aggies comeback overshadowed another great mark in school history. Senior wide receiver Elijah Bell became the Aggies all-time leading receiver in yards breaking a record Herbert Harbison had for more than three decades. Bell broke the record on a 42-yard reception from graduate quarterback Kyll Carter with 9:23 remaining in the game.

Bell leads all Aggies with 2,347 career receiving yards.

But on Thursday night and throughout the season, the Aggies are showing the rest of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) there are multiple ways they can beat you.

N.C. A&T got another stellar game from junior running back Jah-Maine Martin and the Aggies defense delivered its second shutout in its last six games played in a 37-0 win over Delaware State Thursday night at BB&T Stadium. The win marks the seventh straight season the Aggies have won their MEAC opener.

NORFOLK, Va. - North Carolina A&T scored quickly and often Saturday afternoon at Dick Price Stadium. The result was a 58-19 blowout of Norfolk State. The Aggies were aided four one-play scoring drives to defeat the Spartans for the sixth straight season.

N.C. A&T has 10 scoring drives this season of three plays or less. Six of those drives are one-play drives.

That has to be demoralizing for a team," said N.C. A&T junior running back Jah-Maine Martin. "You believe you have a chance and then boom, one play, and we're in the end zone."

Martin has been the one most responsible for taking down opponents' morale. Martin scored three more rushing touchdowns to give him 11 for the season, which is eight shy of breaking Tarik Cohen's single-season record. Martin also added 199 yards rushing on 10 carries, which means he could lead the nation in rushing and yards per carry by Monday.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - For the second straight season, North Carolina A&T versus Florida A&M in football came down to the last play.

For the second straight season, the FAMU Rattlers came out on top. The Rattlers handed the Aggies their first loss in conference play in six games with a 34-31 overtime win at Bragg Memorial Stadium Sunday afternoon.

Backup Rattlers quarterback Rasean McKay connected with Marcus Williams for the game-winning touchdown pass. The loss drops the Aggies, the No. 10 team in the nation, to 4-2 overall and 2-1 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC).

Florida A&M (6-1, 4-0 MEAC) is in a first-place tie in the conference with Bethune-Cookman (4-0) but they are ineligible for postseason play. N.C. A&T is in a tie with S.C. State in the standings and behind Bethune-Cookman for first place as teams continue to jockey for a spot in the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl on Dec. 21 at Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

The adrenaline was high from the beginning as both teams came into the game undefeated in the MEAC. By the end of the game, in addition to Bell and McCain not in the game, the Aggies were also without starting quarterback Kyll Carter who kept cramping.

EAST GREENSBORO - There are not too many true freshmen who can play for a defense North Carolina A&T head coach Sam Washington is associated with. Freshman linebacker Jacob Roberts is their exception. Saturday afternoon he showed why. In first-ever Greatest Homecoming on Earth, Roberts recorded 15 tackles, three sacks and had six tackles for loss as the Aggies obliterated Howard University 64-6 in front of a sellout crowd of 21,500 at BB&T Stadium.

The win gives the Aggies (5-2, 3-1 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference), the 18th-ranked team in the nation, their ninth straight homecoming win. The Aggies have won by an average margin of 32.4 points in those nine victories. Howard dropped to 1-7 on the season and 1-3 in the MEAC.

Roberts and the Aggies defense held Howard to 173 yards of offense. Senior Chris Moseley had two interceptions, and Howard freshman quarterback Quinton Williams was sacked six times. Roberts, who made his first career start last week at Florida A&M, is third on the team in tackles with 45. He made plays in the open field, in Howard's backfield and on special teams on Saturday.

N.C. A&T's defense had plenty of help from the offense. Junior running back Jah-Maine Martin had another superb afternoon as he rushed for 138 yards and three touchdowns on just seven carries. Martin averaged an incredible 19.7 yards per career as he had touchdowns runs of 65, 55 and nine.

ORANGEBURG, S.C. - When quarterback Kyll Carter stepped on the field at Oliver C. Dawson Stadium in 2015 as a freshman and threw one of the most historic touchdown passes in North Carolina A&T football history in a win over the South Carolina State Bulldogs, very few people had ever heard his name. When Carter walked off the field at Oliver C. Stadium on Saturday for the final time in his career, it is assumed everyone associated with S.C. State would rather forget his name from now until the end of time.

Carter recorded career highs in passing yards (267), completions (21) and pass attempts (38) and he threw a touchdown pass to lead the Aggies to a crucial 22-20 win over the Bulldogs. He also rushed for 73 yards, had a career-high 340 yards of offense and accounted for 57 of the Aggies 79 plays. The win puts the Aggies (6-2, 4-1 MEAC) in a first-place tie for the conference lead with Bethune-Cookman. Florida A&M is undefeated in the conference but are not eligible for the MEAC championship or the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl that comes along with it because of sanctions. Included in Carter's great day was a crucial third-down completion to senior Elijah Bell that ice the game late in the fourth quarter. The Aggies did win their fifth straight over the Bulldogs (5-3, 3-2 MEAC). It was Carter who as the third-string quarterback on the Aggies roster came off the bench against the Bulldogs in 2015 because one quarterback ahead of him on the depth chart was injured and the other was ineffective and threw a game-winning touchdown pass to Khrist Gardin to help the Aggies escape with a 9-6 win that eventually propelled them to the first-ever Celebration Bowl.

ORANGEBURG, S.C. - For the second straight season, an underdog Morgan State football team found a way to beat a nationally-ranked team and the defending Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) champions in North Carolina A&T.

This time the upset occurred at Hughes Stadium in Baltimore as the Bears defeated the 14th-ranked Aggies 22-16. But unlike last season, this game counts toward the MEAC standings. Last season when the Bears beat the Aggies 16-13 at BB&T Stadium, it was deemed a non-conference loss because Hampton's departure from the conference created an unbalanced schedule, therefore, teams only played seven conference games instead of eight.

On Saturday, it counted in a painful way. The Aggies are chasing their fourth Celebration Bowl bid in five seasons and their third straight overall. They came in with the task of having to win out to guarantee another berth. But now with their loss coupled with Bethune-Cookman's loss to Delaware State on Saturday, things have become remarkably interesting.

N.C. A&T's path to the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl is still pretty simple. The Aggies are 6-3 overall and 4-2 in the MEAC and are in a three-way tie for first place with Bethune-Cookman and S.C. State because the Florida Rattlers, who are undefeated in MEAC play, is ineligible for postseason play and a conference championship. Therefore, if the Aggies win their final two games, at home against Bethune-Cookman on Saturday, Nov. 16 and at home against rival N.C. Central on Nov. 23, they're headed to Atlanta to play in Mercedes-Benz Stadium against the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) champion.

EAST GREENSBORO - North Carolina A&T responded the way a champion should respond. The two-time defending Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) and HBCU national champions bounced back from a humiliating loss last week at Morgan State to dominate one of the best teams in the MEAC in Bethune-Cookman with a 47-17 win at BB&T Stadium on a Saturday afternoon filled with a brisk and chilly wind.

The Aggies (7-3, 5-2 MEAC) avoided losing back-to-back conference games for the first time since 2013 by simply running the football. N.C. A&T ran 63 plays on Saturday. Fifty of their plays were runs as they compiled 300 yards on the ground led by junior running back Jah-Maine Martin who finished with 120 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries.

Martin's third touchdown on the day, a 7-yard romp up through the middle of the Wildcats defense earned him N.C. A&T's single-season rushing touchdowns record. It was his 19th rushing touchdown of the season breaking Tarik Cohen's record of 18. Martin's 19th touchdown also tied Cohen for the school's single-season record in total touchdowns.

There is plenty of work for the Aggies to do. The win pushes them closer to another Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl berth, their fourth in five years and their third straight overall. But there is still one regular-season game to play and that is against archival N.C. Central 1 p.m., Saturday, November 23 at BB&T Stadium.

EAST GREENSBORO - North Carolina A&T fans have grown accustomed to spending a weekend in Atlanta watching Aggies football in an NFL stadium. Why change things now? The Aggies are headed back to the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl and they have secured another Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) championship.

On a historic but dreary and rainy Saturday afternoon at BB&T Stadium, the Aggies made things much worse than the weather did for their archrivals N.C. Central by manhandling the Eagles to the tune of a 54-0 drubbing.

It was the most lopsided win in the 91-game series history. It also marked the most points the Aggies have ever scored against the Eagles and it was the first time either team reached or exceeded 50 points in the series.

The win puts the Aggies (8-3, 6-2 MEAC) in the Celebration Bowl for the third straight season and for the fourth time in five years. The bowl game itself is 5 years old. In addition, the Aggies claimed their 11th overall MEAC championship.

N.C. A&T is on the best run of any MEAC school since S.C. State won six out of seven MEAC titles from 1977-83. The Aggies will not know their Celebration Bowl opponent until Dec. 7.
